- Sec. 72.201. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 8
- (1) "Accredited crime laboratory" means a crime 9
- laboratory, as that term is defined by Article 38.35, Code of 10
- Criminal Procedure, that has been accredited under Article 38.01 of 11

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- (2) "Commission" means the Texas Forensic Science 13
- 14 Commission.
- (3) "Pilot program" means the Texas forensic analyst 15
- 16 apprenticeship pilot program established under this subchapter.
- Sec. 72.202. TEXAS FORENSIC ANALYST APPRENTICESHIP PILOT 17
- PROGRAM. (a) The office shall establish the Texas forensic analyst 18
- apprenticeship pilot program to increase the forensic science 19
- workforce capacity in this state. The office shall collaborate with 20
- the commission as necessary to administer the pilot program. 21
- (b) To implement the pilot program, the office shall enter 22
- 23 into contracts with:
- 24 (1) the Center for Human Identification at the

- 2 the purpose of creating a unified forensic biology (DNA) training

- 4 (2) the Institute for Forensic Research, Training, and

- 11 that <u>is awarded an apprentice position by the commission under</u>

- 13 Sec. 72.203. FORENSIC ANALYST APPRENTICE POSITIONS; RULES.
- 14 (a) In consultation with the office, the commission by rule shall
- 15 <u>adopt eligibility requirements for:</u>
- (1) individuals who may apply for an apprentice
- 17 position under the pilot program; and
- 18 <u>(2) publicly funded accredited crime laboratories</u>
- 19 that may apply to sponsor an apprentice under the pilot program.
- 20 (b) In establishing the eligibility requirements under
- 21 Subsection (a), the commission shall prioritize the long-term
- 22 <u>retention of forensic analysts in accredited crime laboratories in</u>
- 23 this state.
- (c) The commission shall award apprentice positions to
- 25 <u>individuals</u> and accredited crime laboratories that meet the

- 2 <u>(d) The commission shall:</u>
- 3 (1) consult with the Texas Association of Crime Lab
- 4 Directors to determine the current need for forensic analyst
- 5 apprentices in each forensic discipline; and
- 6 (2) in consultation with the office, adopt rules
- 7 regarding the required training curricula for the forensic science
- 8 training programs described by Sections 72.202(b)(1), (2), and (3).

- 10 1, 2030.
- 11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
