C.S.H.B. No. 5469

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT  
2 relating to the effect of provisions of laws enacted during the  
3 regular session of the 89th Legislature requiring certain state  
4 agencies to create reports.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "report" means an ad  
7 hoc or periodic publication, study, compilation of information,  
8 statement, or written work product produced by an agency in the  
9 executive or judicial branch of state government for distribution  
10 to:

11 (1) the legislature or an agency in the legislative  
12 branch of state government; or

13 (2) an officer or agency in the executive branch of  
14 state government.

15 SECTION 2. ABOLITION OF REPORTS. Except as otherwise  
16 specifically provided by this Act, an agency in the executive or  
17 judicial branch of state government is not required to create a  
18 report if an Act of the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025,  
19 that becomes law creates the reporting requirement.

20 SECTION 3. EXEMPT REPORTS; REPORTS REQUIRED BY FEDERAL LAW.  
21 (a) Section 2 of this Act does not apply to a report required by the  
22 following legislation:

23 (1) H.B. No. 2 or similar legislation of the 89th  
24 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to public education

1 and public school finance;

2 (2) H.B. No. 6 or similar legislation of the 89th  
3 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to discipline in  
4 public schools;

5 (3) H.B. No. 12 or similar legislation of the 89th  
6 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the review and  
7 audit of certain state agency operations;

8 (4) H.B. No. 18 or similar legislation of the 89th  
9 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the establishment  
10 and administration of certain programs and services providing  
11 health care services to rural counties;

12 (5) H.B. No. 26 or similar legislation of the 89th  
13 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to requiring  
14 contracts with Medicaid managed care organizations to permit the  
15 organizations to offer nutrition support services in lieu of other  
16 state Medicaid plan services;

17 (6) H.B. No. 29 or similar legislation of the 89th  
18 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to water losses  
19 reported by certain municipally owned utilities to the Texas Water  
20 Development Board; authorizing administrative penalties;

21 (7) H.B. No. 35 or similar legislation of the 89th  
22 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to a peer support  
23 network for first responders;

24 (8) H.B. No. 36 or similar legislation of the 89th  
25 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the monitoring of  
26 certain family violence offenders, the provision of resources for  
27 family violence victims, and the collection of information about

1 conditions of bond imposed in family violence cases and certain  
2 other criminal cases;

3 (9) H.B. No. 38 or similar legislation of the 89th  
4 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to improvements to the  
5 Texas Information and Referral Network;

6 (10) H.B. No. 107 or similar legislation of the 89th  
7 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the establishment  
8 of the sickle cell disease registry;

9 (11) H.B. No. 112 or similar legislation of the 89th  
10 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the creation and  
11 operation of a science park district in certain counties;

12 (12) H.B. No. 114 or similar legislation of the 89th  
13 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the transition of  
14 certain veterans' mental health initiatives from the Texas Health  
15 and Human Services Commission to the Texas Veterans Commission;

16 (13) H.B. No. 118 or similar legislation of the 89th  
17 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the establishment  
18 and powers and duties of the Texas Advisory Committee on  
19 Geopolitical Conflict;

20 (14) H.B. No. 121 or similar legislation of the 89th  
21 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to measures for  
22 ensuring public school safety, including the commissioning of peace  
23 officers by the Texas Education Agency, the composition of the  
24 board of directors of the Texas School Safety Center, public school  
25 safety and security requirements and resources, and the reporting  
26 of child abuse or neglect by public school employees;

27 (15) H.B. No. 140 or similar legislation of the 89th

1 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the creation of the  
2 child and adult protective investigations advisory committee in the  
3 Department of Family and Protective Services;

4 (16) H.B. No. 141 or similar legislation of the 89th  
5 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the adoption of the  
6 revised Interstate Compact for the Placement of Children by the  
7 State of Texas; making conforming changes;

8 (17) H.B. No. 149 or similar legislation of the 89th  
9 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to regulation of the  
10 use of artificial intelligence systems in this state; providing  
11 civil penalties;

12 (18) H.B. No. 150 or similar legislation of the 89th  
13 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the establishment  
14 of the Texas Cyber Command as a component institution of The  
15 University of Texas System and the transfer to it of certain powers  
16 and duties of the Department of Information Resources;

17 (19) H.B. No. 500 or similar legislation of the 89th  
18 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to making  
19 supplemental appropriations and reductions in appropriations and  
20 giving direction and adjustment authority regarding  
21 appropriations;

22 (20) H.B. No. 1500 or similar legislation of the 89th  
23 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the continuation  
24 and functions of the Department of Information Resources, including  
25 the composition of the governing body of the department;

26 (21) H.B. No. 3526 or similar legislation of the 89th  
27 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to fiscal

1 transparency for bonds issued by local governmental entities;

2 (22) H.B. No. 3770 or similar legislation of the 89th  
3 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to efficiency and  
4 strategic fiscal reviews of state agencies conducted by the  
5 Legislative Budget Board;

6 (23) H.B. No. 3963 or similar legislation of the 89th  
7 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to an early childhood  
8 integrated data system;

9 (24) S.B. No. 2 or similar legislation of the 89th  
10 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the establishment  
11 of an education savings account program; or

12 (25) S.B. No. 5 or similar legislation of the 89th  
13 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the creation of the  
14 Dementia Prevention and Research Institute of Texas.

15 (b) Section 2 of this Act does not apply to a report created  
16 by an Act of the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, that  
17 becomes law if an agency in the executive or judicial branch of  
18 state government is required to create the report to comply with  
19 federal law.

20 SECTION 4. EFFECT OF ACT. (a) This Act prevails over any  
21 provision of another Act of the 89th Legislature, Regular Session,  
22 2025, that becomes law that purports to require an agency in the  
23 executive or judicial branch of state government to create a  
24 report, regardless of the relative dates of enactment.

25 (b) An exemption from the application of this Act contained  
26 in another Act of the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, has  
27 no effect.

1           SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.       This Act takes effect  
2 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members  
3 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas  
4 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for  
5 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
