9	(1) "Hotel" has the meaning assigned by Section
10	<u>156.001, Tax Code.</u>
11	(2) "Human trafficking activity" means conduct that
12	constitutes an offense under Section 20A.02 or 20A.03, Penal Code.
13	(b) The governing body of a municipality may suspend or
14	revoke a certificate of occupancy for a hotel located in the
15	<pre>municipality if:</pre>
16	(1) a law enforcement officer provides an affidavit of
17	probable cause swearing that criminal human trafficking activity is
18	occurring in the hotel;
19	(2) a court with criminal jurisdiction in the county
20	in which the hotel is located issues an order stating the court's
21	finding of probable cause that human trafficking activity is
22	occurring at the hotel; and
23	(3) the municipality follows the procedures described
24	by Subsection (d) before suspending or revoking the certificate of

1	occupancy.
2	(c) This section does not limit a hotel owner's or
3	operator's right to a public hearing and to present evidence at a
4	proceeding regarding the suspension or revocation of a certificate
5	of occupancy.
6	(d) A municipality that seeks to suspend or revoke a
7	certificate of occupancy for a hotel under this section shall
8	follow procedures that are consistent with the suspension or
9	revocation of a certificate of occupancy for any other type of
10	business or use of land within the municipality.
11	(e) This section may not be construed to create a private
12	cause of action.
13	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
