4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 490J, Government Code, is added to read
6	as follows:
7	Sec. 490J.001. CLEAN HYDROGEN DEVELOPMENT FUND. (a) The
8	Clean Hydrogen Development Fund is established as a special fund in
9	the state treasury to finance clean hydrogen projects.
0	(b) The fund shall be administered by the comptroller in

- 10 <u>(b) The fund shall be administered by the comptroller in</u> 11 <u>consultation with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and</u>
- 12 the Texas Railroad Commission.
- (c) Money in the fund may be used to provide:
- 14 (1) low interest loans for hydrogen infrastructure and
- 15 production facilities;
- 16 (2) state-backed bonds for the financing of hydrogen
- 17 projects; or
- 18 (3) state grants for hydrogen electrolyzer
- 19 manufacturing in this state.
- 20 (d) The fund may accept federal grants, private donations,
- 21 and legislative appropriations.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter L, Chapter 171, Tax Code, is amended
- 23 by adding Section 171.603 to read as follows:
- Sec. 171.603. CLEAN HYDROGEN TAX INCENTIVES. (a) A person

- 1 or business entity that constructs or operates a clean hydrogen
- 2 production facility in this state may be eligible for a state tax
- 3 credit.
- 4 (b) The credit shall be equivalent to 20 percent of
- 5 qualified capital expenditures related to hydrogen production,
- 6 transport, or storage.
- 7 (c) A manufacturer of hydrogen electrolyzers relocating to
- 8 Texas from out of state shall receive:
- 9 (1) a 10-year franchise tax exemption; and
- 10 (2) a sales tax exemption on equipment purchases used
- 11 <u>in manufacturing</u>.
- 12 (d) The comptroller shall adopt rules necessary for
- 13 implementation, including reporting requirements to track economic
- 14 impact.
- 15 SECTION 3. Chapter 502, Transportation Code, is amended by
- 16 adding Section 502.257 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 502.257. TEMPORARY HIGHWAY TAX RELIEF FOR HYDROGEN
- 18 VEHICLES. (a) Hydrogen-powered vehicles, including hydrogen
- 19 internal combustion engine and fuel cell vehicles, shall be exempt
- 20 from state highway use taxes for ten years or until cost parity with
- 21 <u>conventional energy sources is reached, as determined by the Texas</u>
- 22 Commission on Environmental Quality.
- (b) The exemption applies to commercial trucking, rail,
- 24 shipping, and aviation operators.
- 25 SECTION 4. Chapter 136, Education Code, is amended by
- 26 adding Section 136.008 to read as follows:
- Sec. 136.008. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES. (a) The

- 1 Texas Workforce Development Commission shall establish
- 2 partnerships with universities, technical schools, or community
- 3 colleges to provide specialized training for hydrogen sector jobs.
- 4 (b) The Workforce Commission may provide grants to
- 5 <u>educational institutions to develop curriculum and certification</u>
- 6 programs for hydrogen technology.
- 7 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
