- 1 WHEREAS, Small businesses are an essential element of our
- 2 state's economy, and their viability has far-reaching benefits for
- 3 the communities in which they operate; and
- WHEREAS, Texas is home to 3.1 million small businesses, which
- 5 are defined as companies that employ fewer than 500 people; these
- 6 enterprises represent 99.8 percent of all businesses in Texas, and
- 7 they employ close to half of the state's residents; and
- 8 WHEREAS, From clothing designers to food trucks, bookstores
- 9 to auto mechanics, and tech startups to construction firms, small
- 10 businesses operate in a diverse range of industries and provide a
- 11 broad spectrum of products and services; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Beyond providing goods and services, small
- 13 businesses create jobs and stimulate commercial activity within
- 14 their communities; their role as engines of economic productivity
- 15 stems from the fact that the businesses often rely on local supply
- 16 chains, and their smaller size allows them to adapt to and
- 17 accommodate the demands of local customers and the unique character
- 18 of their neighborhoods; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Despite being major drivers of commercial growth,
- 20 small businesses face significant challenges, including economic
- 21 uncertainty, rising costs, and difficulties in finding workers;
- 22 fostering a supportive environment for these enterprises is key to
- 23 ensuring their long-term viability and will assist hardworking
- 24 entrepreneurs in adjusting to changing market conditions; and

1 WHEREAS, By choosing to patronize small businesses, we are

2 investing in the future prosperity of our towns and cities and our

3 state at large, and it is fitting that we set aside a day each month

4 to encourage Texans to shop local and show their support for the

5 small businesses in their communities; now, therefore, be it

6 RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas

hereby designate the first Saturday of every month as Small

8 Business Saturday; and, be it further
