## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Small businesses are an essential element of our
- 2 state's economy, and their viability has far-reaching benefits for
- the communities in which they operate; and 3
- WHEREAS, Texas is home to 3.1 million small businesses, which 4
- 5 are defined as companies that employ fewer than 500 people; these
- enterprises represent 99.8 percent of all businesses in Texas, and 6
- 7 they employ close to half of the state's residents; and
- 8 WHEREAS, From clothing designers to food trucks, bookstores
- 9 to auto mechanics, and tech startups to construction firms, small
- businesses operate in a diverse range of industries and provide a 10
- broad spectrum of products and services; the entrepreneurs who lead 11
- 12 these endeavors are likewise diverse, with a sizeable proportion of
- small businesses being owned by women and members of racial 13
- minority groups; and 14
- WHEREAS, Beyond providing goods and services, 15
- 16 businesses create jobs and stimulate commercial activity within
- their communities; their role as engines of economic productivity 17
- stems from the fact that the businesses often rely on local supply 18
- chains, and their smaller size allows them to adapt to and 19
- accommodate the demands of local customers and the unique character 20
- of their neighborhoods; and 21
- WHEREAS, Despite being major drivers of commercial growth, 22
- 23 small businesses face significant challenges, including economic
- uncertainty, rising costs, and difficulties in finding workers; 24

- 1 fostering a supportive environment for these enterprises is key to
- 2 ensuring their long-term viability and will assist hardworking
- 3 entrepreneurs in adjusting to changing market conditions; and
- 4 WHEREAS, By choosing to patronize small businesses, we are
- 5 investing in the future prosperity of our towns and cities and our
- 6 state at large, and it is fitting that we set aside a day each month
- 7 to encourage Texans to shop local and show their support for the
- 8 small businesses in their communities; now, therefore, be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 10 hereby designate the first Saturday of every month as Small
- 11 Business Saturday; and, be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That, in accordance with the provisions of
- 13 Section 391.004(d), Government Code, this designation remain in
- 14 effect until the 10th anniversary of the date this resolution is
- 15 finally passed by the legislature.
