HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, For more than 70 years, Rockwall County has been a 2 sought-after destination for brides- and grooms-to-be, and its 3 popularity as a marriage location is known throughout the Lone Star 4 State; and

WHEREAS, During the 1940s and 1950s, couples flocked to 5 Rockwall County to tie the knot because of the unique approach that 6 7 the county took to administrating marriages in that era; a night watchman at the courthouse, Gene Payne, filled in as the deputy 8 county clerk, which allowed marriage licenses to be issued at all 9 hours; in addition, a local doctor kept his office open late to 10 11 provide the blood tests that were required before a license could be 12 issued; the popularity of Rockwall County as a place to say "I do" was such that justice of the peace Mildred Barnes, one of only a few 13 14 women in the state to serve in that role at the time, officiated the weddings of more than 6,000 couples from 1952 to 1957; and 15

16 WHEREAS, The practice of issuing marriage licenses around the clock ended in the 1950s, when the county was required by law to 17 provide this service during regular business hours; nevertheless, 18 the county has remained a top choice for prospective newlyweds 19 20 drawn by the uncommon beauty and elegance of its marriage 21 certificates, which have long been among the most coveted in the state; the county is further admired for its wide selection of 22 23 wedding venues that suit a variety of tastes and styles, ranging from luxurious manors to scenic gardens and pastoral ranch venues; 24

2 WHEREAS, Rockwall County has long served as the setting where 3 couples have shared their vows and embarked upon a momentous 4 journey together, and it is indeed fitting that the county be 5 formally recognized for its special connection to the institution 6 of marriage, both historically and in the present day; now, 7 therefore, be it

8 RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas 9 hereby designate Rockwall County as the official Marriage Capital 10 of Texas; and, be it further

11 RESOLVED, That, in accordance with the provisions of 12 Section 391.003(e), Government Code, this designation remain in 13 effect until the 10th anniversary of the date this resolution is 14 finally passed by the legislature.
