1-15 HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1-16 WHEREAS, U.S. Navy SEAL Nathan Gage Ingram of Roanoke served
1-17 his country with uncommon valor, and his family, friends, and
1-18 fellow Americans suffered a tragic loss when this courageous Texan
1-19 went missing while conducting a mission off the coast of Somalia on
1-20 January 12, 2024, at the age of 27; and

1-21 WHEREAS, Special Warfare Operator 2nd Class Gage Ingram was
1-22 among the members of SEAL Team 3 who were assigned to board a ship
1-23 smuggling Iranian missile components bound for Houthi militants in
1-24 Yemen; during the hazardous nighttime operation in rough seas, a
1-25 member of the unit fell from the ship; SO2 Ingram heroically jumped
1-26 into the water in an attempt to rescue his fellow SEAL, but both men
1-27 were ultimately lost at sea; and

1-28 WHEREAS, Born on March 22, 1996, Gage Ingram graduated from
1-29 Byron Nelson High School in Trophy Club, where he played football
1-30 and basketball and served as the manager of the varsity basketball
1-31 team; as a young man, he endeared himself to others with his
1-32 kindness, selflessness, and dependability, and he was active in the
1-33 school's Young Life chapter for Christian youth; and

1-34 WHEREAS, Mr. Ingram went on to earn a degree at Texas Tech
1-35 University, and during his college years, he set his sights on
1-36 becoming a Navy SEAL; he enlisted in the U.S. Navy in 2019 and
1-37 completed the demanding SEAL qualification training in 2021,
1-38 joining the ranks of one of the most elite military units in the
1-39 world; over the course of his military career, he was awarded the
1-40 Navy "E" Ribbon, the National Defense Service Medal, and the Global
1-41 War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal; and

1-42 WHEREAS, Through his selfless commitment and immeasurable
1-43 sacrifice, Nathan Gage Ingram exemplified the highest ideals of our
1-44 nation's armed forces, and it is indeed appropriate that a special
1-45 day be set aside to honor the memory of this valiant Texan; now,
1-46 therefore, be it

1-47 RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas
1-48 hereby designate January 12 as Nathan Gage Ingram Day; and, be it
1-49 further

1-50 RESOLVED, That, in accordance with the provisions of
1-51 Section 391.004(d), Government Code, this designation remain in
1-52 effect until the 10th anniversary of the date this resolution is
1-53 finally passed by the legislature.
