CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, A life made rich through meaningful service drew to 2 a close with the passing of decorated Vietnam War veteran Clarence 3 Eugene Sasser of Sandy Point on May 13, 2024, at the age of 76; and WHEREAS, The son of Willie Sasser Jr. and Alice Brown, 4 5 Clarence Sasser was born in Chenango on September 2, 1947; he was raised by his mother and stepfather on a farm in Rosharon, where he 6 7 grew up with his siblings and stepsiblings; after graduating from Marshall High School in 1965, he began studying chemistry at the 8 University of Houston; he was drafted into the U.S. Army in 1967, 9 and he served in Vietnam as a medic with the 3rd Battalion, 60th 10 11 Infantry, 9th Infantry Division; and 12 WHEREAS, On January 10, 1968, Private First Class Sasser was participating in a reconnaissance mission when enemies attacked his 13 14 unit, killing more than 30 U.S. service members in the first few minutes; Private Sasser ran through a hail of bullets to help his 15 16 injured comrades, and he continued to provide treatment even after being severely wounded; once the group had crawled to a safer area, 17 18 he tended to the survivors for five hours before they were all evacuated; he recovered from his injuries in Japan, and he later 19 20 accepted an assignment there; along the way, he rose to the rank of 21 specialist fifth class; and WHEREAS, In recognition of his courageous actions during the 22 23 Vietnam War, Specialist Sasser was presented with the Medal of

Honor by President Richard M. Nixon during a White House ceremony on

- 1 March 7, 1969; his other military honors included the Distinguished
- 2 Service Cross, Purple Heart, National Defense Service Medal,
- 3 Vietnam Service Medal, and Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Sasser returned to civilian life in June 1969
- 5 and continued his chemistry studies at Texas A&M University before
- 6 accepting a position at a petrochemical refinery near Houston; he
- 7 went on to enjoy a rewarding career as a decision review officer
- 8 with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Active in his community, Mr. Sasser was president of
- 10 the Northwest Brazoria County Servicemen's Association and a member
- 11 of New St. Philip Missionary Baptist Church; among his many
- 12 achievements, he was inducted into the Texas A&M Hall of Honor in
- 13 2013 and was awarded an honorary doctor of letters degree from the
- 14 university; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Sasser shared a fulfilling marriage with his
- 16 wife, Ethel, that spanned many years before her passing, and he took
- 17 great pride in their three sons, Benjamin Sasser and Rossano
- 18 Dickey, who preceded their father in death, and Billy Sasser; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Clarence Sasser exemplified the highest ideals of
- 20 the U.S. armed forces, and he leaves behind a record of service to
- 21 his country that will continue to inspire all those who knew him;
- 22 now, therefore, be it
- 23 RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 24 hereby pay tribute to the life of Clarence Eugene Sasser and extend
- 25 heartfelt sympathy to his loved ones; and, be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
- 27 prepared for his family and that when the Texas House of
