1-15 HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1-16 WHEREAS, Necrotizing enterocolitis, or NEC, is the most  
1-17 common cause of death in hospitalized premature infants after two  
1-18 weeks of age; and

1-19 WHEREAS, This life-threatening disease occurs when bacteria  
1-20 attack the lining of the intestines, causing cellular destruction  
1-21 in the small and large intestines; it almost exclusively affects  
1-22 newborns, particularly those born prematurely, and mortality rates  
1-23 range from 10 to 50 percent in most cases; and

1-24 WHEREAS, Diagnosing NEC is challenging, as symptoms are vague  
1-25 and often attributable to other causes; severe cases may require  
1-26 surgical intervention, and many of those who survive the disease  
1-27 experience lifelong neurological and nutritional complications;  
1-28 and

1-29 WHEREAS, The feeding of breast milk is one of the most  
1-30 effective ways of preventing NEC in vulnerable infants, and when  
1-31 the mother's milk is unavailable, pasteurized donor human milk is  
1-32 the safest option for infants at risk of the disease; donated breast  
1-33 milk has been critical to reducing the mortality rate, and  
1-34 organizations such as the Mothers' Milk Bank of North Texas and the  
1-35 Mothers' Milk Bank at Austin are helping to ensure that babies have  
1-36 access to the health benefits that breast milk provides; and

1-37 WHEREAS, Necrotizing enterocolitis poses a serious risk to  
1-38 infants in their earliest weeks and months of life, and the  
1-39 observance of Necrotizing Enterocolitis and Breastfeeding  
1-40 Awareness Month serves as a means of educating the public about this  
1-41 devastating illness and the importance of breastfeeding as a  
1-42 preventative measure; now, therefore, be it

1-43 RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas  
1-44 hereby designate May as Necrotizing Enterocolitis and  
1-45 Breastfeeding Awareness Month; and, be it further

1-46 RESOLVED, That, in accordance with the provisions of  
1-47 Section 391.004(d), Government Code, this designation remain in  
1-48 effect until the 10th anniversary of the date this resolution is  
1-49 finally passed by the legislature.

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
