## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Human trafficking is a serious and escalating
- 2 problem in the United States, particularly in Texas; and
- 3 WHEREAS, A multibillion-dollar business, human trafficking
- 4 is one of the fastest-growing illegal enterprises, according to the
- 5 Polaris Project, a Washington, D.C.-based organization that
- 6 maintains the National Human Trafficking Hotline; thousands of
- 7 foreign nationals are trafficked into the United States each year,
- 8 and it is estimated that the number of U.S. citizens trafficked
- 9 within our own borders is even higher; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Texas is a major point of illegal entry into the
- 11 United States; its large geographic size along with its
- 12 demographics make the Lone Star State appealing to traffickers, who
- 13 endeavor to blend into the population while exploiting their
- 14 victims in forced labor and prostitution; and
- WHEREAS, Although Texas has been recognized as a leader in
- 16 the effort to end the scourge of human trafficking, eradication of
- 17 this modern-day form of slavery is a difficult challenge, and every
- 18 means of combating it should be explored; now, therefore, be it
- 19 RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 20 hereby request the Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House
- 21 of Representatives to create a joint interim committee to study the
- 22 problem of human trafficking in Texas; and, be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That the committee's proceedings and operations be
- 24 governed by such general rules and policies for interim committees
