HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, The Lone Star State is renowned for the beauty and
- 2 diversity of its many public gardens and parks and for the
- 3 dedication its residents have demonstrated to preserving and
- 4 sustaining these oases of greenery; and
- 5 WHEREAS, While outstanding gardens can be found in many
- 6 communities throughout the state, the city of Nacogdoches has
- 7 distinguished itself for the number and variety of its green and
- 8 flowering public spaces; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Nacogdoches is located on a site once occupied by
- 10 members of the Nacogdoche tribe, a group of the Caddo people whose
- 11 culture was based on farming; a Spanish mission was established
- 12 there in 1716, and the town has been a civil settlement since 1779;
- 13 as early as 1853, the city's gardens were noted in the diary of a
- 14 famous visitor, Frederick Law Olmsted, the landscape architect who
- 15 later designed New York's Central Park and numerous other iconic
- 16 public spaces around the nation; and
- WHEREAS, Today, Nacogdoches helps to preserve the state's
- 18 horticultural heritage through re-creations of traditional gardens
- 19 at the Durst-Taylor Historic House and Gardens, the Sterne-Hoya
- 20 House Museum and Library, Millard's Crossing Historic Village, and
- 21 the Old Nacogdoches University Building; and
- 22 WHEREAS, The city's splendid green spaces also include
- 23 Eugenia Sterne Park, Margil Park, Zion Hill Baptist Church
- 24 Cemetery, Oak Grove Cemetery, and the Pocket Park and the Plaza

- 1 Principal in the historic downtown; moreover, Liberty Memorial
- 2 Garden commemorates with dignity and grace the lives lost during
- 3 the tragic events of 9/11; and
- WHEREAS, Nacogdoches is home to Stephen F. Austin State
- 5 University, which is landscaped with overstory and ornamental trees
- 6 to maintain the Pineywoods ecosystem and the natural beauty of the
- 7 campus; the university's 138 acres of gardens include the SFA Mast
- 8 Arboretum, the Pineywoods Native Plant Center, the Gayla Mize
- 9 Garden, the Jim and Beth Kingham Children's Garden, the Plantery,
- 10 and Jimmy Hinds Park; in addition, the Baldcypress Collection and
- 11 the Crape Myrtle Collection are renowned for their impressive
- 12 display of those species; each year, SFA Gardens hosts programs
- 13 that provide information on sustainable gardening and the
- 14 preservation of native plants, while the Nacogdoches Independent
- 15 School District supports initiatives that encourage students to
- 16 maintain and study gardens on the grounds of their schools; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Home of the annual Nacogdoches Azalea Trail each
- 18 March, the community was the first to be recognized as part of the
- 19 Azalea Society of America's Azalea City Program in 2004 and was
- 20 recertified in 2012; the Ruby M. Mize Azalea Garden on the SFA
- 21 campus is the largest such garden in the state, with more than 7,000
- 22 evergreen and native azaleas on display; another of the city's
- 23 notable sites is the Nacogdoches County Master Gardeners
- 24 Demonstration Garden on the former site of Aqua Vitae Park, which
- 25 was developed by the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service in
- 26 cooperation with the city and Nacogdoches County; and
- 27 WHEREAS, The thoughtful cultivation of the splendor of nature

- 1 is one of the most sublime expressions of the human spirit, and the
- 2 skill and devotion with which the city of Nacogdoches has showcased
- 3 its lovely trees and flowering plants is indeed deserving of
- 4 special recognition; now, therefore, be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 6 hereby designate Nacogdoches as the official Garden Capital of
- 7 Texas; and, be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That, in accordance with the provisions of
- 9 Section 391.003(e), Government Code, this designation remain in
- 10 effect until the 10th anniversary of the date this resolution is
- 11 finally passed by the legislature.
