HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The longstanding bonds of friendship between the 2 United States and Taiwan, embodied in the Taiwan Relations Act of 3 1979, continue to yield important economic, social, strategic, and 4 cultural benefits; and

5 WHEREAS, In 2024, U.S.-Taiwan trade reached \$158.6 billion, with Taiwan ranking as the United States' sixth-largest export 6 7 market for American agricultural products and the seventh-largest merchandise trading partner; that same year, Taiwan was fourth on 8 the Heritage Foundation's Index of Economic Freedom; the nation 9 holds an important position in the global economy as a leader in the 10 11 world's information and communications technology industry, and it is a trusted partner for economic cooperation and exchanges in 12 industries such as those for smart machinery, the Internet of 13 14 Things, biotechnology, energy technology, national defense, semiconductors, and the circular economy; and 15

WHEREAS, Taiwanese officials and civil society groups 16 partner with the United States on a range of issues to promote our 17 common values of freedom, democracy, and human rights; these 18 partnerships build on the cooperative tradition of 19 prior 20 initiatives such as the Global Cooperation and Training Framework, 21 which advances Taiwanese leadership in such arenas as democratization, human rights, women's empowerment, and public 22 23 health; and

24 WHEREAS, Since 1988, Texas and Taiwan have maintained a

sister-state relationship, and their robust trade and investment 1 partnership provides a solid foundation for a mutually beneficial 2 3 bilateral trade agreement to spur job creation, further expand the global market, and secure international, democratic supply chains; 4 5 Taiwan is Texas' seventh-largest trade partner, with two-way trade reaching over \$25.5 billion in 2024; in addition, Governor Greg 6 Abbott traveled to Taiwan last year to open the State of Texas 7 Taiwan Office, which facilitates pragmatic connections 8 and exchanges between our peoples, institutions, and economies; and 9

10 WHEREAS, Texas and the United States have benefited 11 immeasurably through decades of unwavering friendship with Taiwan, 12 and it is a pleasure to join in celebrating the longevity of this 13 unique and vibrant partnership; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas hereby express its support for the strengthening of our partnership with Taiwan; and, be it further

17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives and Senate 18 hereby:

(a) commend Governor Greg Abbott for his efforts to
strengthen bilateral trade and investment relations with Taiwan;
and

(b) celebrate the 46th anniversary of the enactment of the Taiwan Relations Act and the 37th anniversary of the sister-state relationship between the State of Texas and Taiwan; and, be it further
