## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, The longstanding bonds of friendship between the
- 2 United States and Taiwan, embodied in the Taiwan Relations Act of
- 3 1979, continue to yield important economic, social, strategic, and
- 4 cultural benefits; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In 2024, U.S.-Taiwan trade reached \$158.6 billion,
- 6 with Taiwan ranking as the United States' sixth-largest export
- 7 market for American agricultural products and the seventh-largest
- 8 merchandise trading partner; that same year, Taiwan was fourth on
- 9 the Heritage Foundation's Index of Economic Freedom; the nation
- 10 holds an important position in the global economy as a leader in the
- 11 world's information and communications technology industry, and it
- 12 is a trusted partner for economic cooperation and exchanges in
- 13 industries such as those for smart machinery, the Internet of
- 14 Things, biotechnology, energy technology, national defense,
- 15 semiconductors, and the circular economy; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Taiwanese officials and civil society groups
- 17 partner with the United States on a range of issues to promote our
- 18 common values of freedom, democracy, and human rights; these
- 19 partnerships build on the cooperative tradition of prior
- 20 initiatives such as the Global Cooperation and Training Framework,
- 21 which advances Taiwanese leadership in such arenas as
- 22 democratization, human rights, women's empowerment, and public
- 23 health; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Since 1988, Texas and Taiwan have maintained a

- 1 sister-state relationship, and their robust trade and investment
- 2 partnership provides a solid foundation for a mutually beneficial
- 3 bilateral trade agreement to spur job creation, further expand the
- 4 global market, and secure international, democratic supply chains;
- 5 Taiwan is Texas' seventh-largest trade partner, with two-way trade
- 6 reaching over \$25.5 billion in 2024; in addition, Governor Greg
- 7 Abbott traveled to Taiwan last year to open the State of Texas
- 8 Taiwan Office, which facilitates pragmatic connections and
- 9 exchanges between our peoples, institutions, and economies; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Texas and the United States have benefited
- 11 immeasurably through decades of unwavering friendship with Taiwan,
- 12 and it is a pleasure to join in celebrating the longevity of this
- 13 unique and vibrant partnership; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 15 hereby express its support for the strengthening of our partnership
- 16 with Taiwan; and, be it further
- 17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives and Senate
- 18 hereby:
- 19 (a) commend Governor Greg Abbott for his efforts to
- 20 strengthen bilateral trade and investment relations with Taiwan;

- (b) celebrate the 46th anniversary of the enactment of the
- 23 Taiwan Relations Act and the 37th anniversary of the sister-state
- 24 relationship between the State of Texas and Taiwan; and, be it
