CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, The Honorable Nathan L. Hecht retired as chief
- 2 justice of the Supreme Court of Texas on December 31, 2024,
- 3 concluding a remarkable 35-year tenure on the court; and
- WHEREAS, First elected to the state's highest civil court in
- 5 1988, Justice Hecht became the longest-serving member in its
- 6 history, as well as the longest-tenured Texas judge in active
- 7 service; in 2013, he was appointed chief justice, and he was twice
- 8 reelected to that post; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Justice Hecht gained wide admiration for his sharp
- 10 intellect, philosophical approach, and commitment to court reform;
- 11 he oversaw revision of the rules of administration, practice, and
- 12 procedure in the state's courts, and his efforts led to the
- 13 simplification of appellate rules and promoted more swift
- 14 resolution of cases; moreover, he drove modernization of
- 15 technology, and Texas adopted e-filing in advance of many other
- 16 states; as president of the National Conference of Chief Justices,
- 17 he advised other states that were taking their systems online
- 18 during the COVID-19 pandemic; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Dedicated to improving access to the justice system,
- 20 Justice Hecht worked to reduce barriers for low-income Texans, and
- 21 he successfully urged the Legislature to increase Legal Aid
- 22 funding; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Justice Hecht was appointed to the federal Advisory
- 24 Committee on Civil Rules by the chief justice of the United States;

- 1 in addition, he served his profession through his service on the
- 2 Council of the American Law Institute, of which he is a life member;
- 3 he is also a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and
- 4 the Philosophical Society of Texas; and
- 5 WHEREAS, A graduate of Yale University and the Southern
- 6 Methodist University Dedman School of Law, Justice Hecht clerked
- 7 for Judge Roger Robb on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District
- 8 of Columbia Circuit; he served as a lieutenant in the U.S. Navy
- 9 Reserve Judge Advocate General's Corps and then entered private
- 10 practice, becoming a partner in the Locke firm in Dallas; appointed
- 11 to the district court in 1981, he was elected to the court of
- 12 appeals five years later; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Over the course of his exemplary career, Nathan
- 14 Hecht helped shape Texas jurisprudence and improve the
- 15 administration of the court system, and his enormous contributions
- 16 will continue to resonate in the years to come; now, therefore, be
- 17 it
- 18 RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 19 hereby congratulate Nathan L. Hecht on his retirement as chief
- 20 justice of the Supreme Court of Texas and extend sincere best wishes
- 21 for the future; and, be it further
