WHEREAS, Aaron F. Reitz has been appointed assistant attorney
general of the U.S. Department of Justice Office of Legal Policy;

WHEREAS, In his new role at the helm of the Office of Legal Policy, Mr. Reitz will oversee the development and implementation of DOJ's policy initiatives, and he will help to carry out special projects for the department; he brings to the position a wealth of experience in law and politics; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Reitz previously served as chief of staff in the 9 office of U.S. Senator Ted Cruz, where he played an instrumental 10 11 role in advancing legislative efforts and public relations 12 campaigns on issues that included border security, technological investment, economic activity, and infrastructure; he also oversaw 13 14 several regional offices across Texas as well as teams focused on the work of the Senate Commerce, Judiciary, and Foreign Relations 15 Committees; and 16

WHEREAS, Prior to working with Senator Cruz, Mr. Reitz served 17 as deputy attorney general for legal strategy for the State of 18 Texas; over the course of his tenure, he planned, staffed, and 19 executed lawsuits and legal initiatives on such issues 20 as 21 immigration, federal-state-local relations, and election integrity, and he directed the agency's lawsuits opposing the 22 23 policies of the Biden administration; in addition, he was senior 24 advisor to Attorney General Ken Paxton's successful 2022 reelection

2 WHEREAS, A proud veteran of the U.S. Marine Corps, Mr. Reitz 3 served on active duty for nearly five years and deployed to 4 Afghanistan; he later graduated from The University of Texas at 5 Austin School of Law; a skilled attorney, he practiced corporate 6 law and commercial litigation in Houston and Austin, and he clerked 7 for Justice Jimmy Blacklock on the Texas Supreme Court; and

8 WHEREAS, The effective operation of government depends on the 9 able and dedicated efforts of our public servants, and Aaron Reitz 10 may reflect with pride on his accomplishments as he takes on the 11 challenges and opportunities of his new position; now, therefore, 12 be it
