- 3 served on active duty for nearly five years and deployed to
- 4 Afghanistan; he later graduated from The University of Texas at

- 6 law and commercial litigation in Houston and Austin, and he clerked
- 7 for Justice Jimmy Blacklock on the Texas Supreme Court; and

- 9 able and dedicated efforts of our public servants, and Aaron Reitz
- 10 may reflect with pride on his accomplishments as he takes on the
- 11 challenges and opportunities of his new position; now, therefore,
