A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment establishing a parent's right
- 2 to direct a child's education.
- 3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Article I, Texas Constitution, is amended by
- 5 adding Section 37 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 37. (a) In this section, "parent" means a natural
- 7 parent, stepparent, adoptive parent, legal guardian, or other legal
- 8 <u>custodian of a child.</u>
- 9 (b) A parent has the right to direct the education of the
- 10 parent's child, including the right to:
- 11 (1) make reasonable choices within the public school
- 12 system;
- 13 (2) choose an alternative to public education, such as
- 14 a private school, including a parochial school or home school;
- 15 (3) access and view public school teaching materials,
- 16 textbooks and other instructional materials, and library books;
- 17 (4) attend meetings of the governing body of a public
- 18 school; and
- 19 <u>(5) access public school student records for the</u>
- 20 parent's child, including the child's student health records.
- 21 (c) The rights described by Subsection (b) of this section
- 22 may not be denied or restricted because the parent or the child is
- 23 an individual with a disability.
- 24 (d) The legislature by general law may provide for processes

- 1 to ensure that the rights described by Subsection (b) of this
- 2 section are upheld.
- 3 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 4 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 4, 2025.
- 5 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 6 proposition: "The constitutional amendment establishing a
- 7 parent's right to direct a child's education."
