A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment regarding the time during
- 2 which the legislature may act on bills or resolutions during a
- 3 regular session.
- 4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 5(b), Article III, Texas Constitution,
- 6 is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) When convened in regular <u>session</u> [Session], the first <u>60</u>
- 8 [thirty] days thereof shall be devoted to the introduction of and
- 9 acting on bills and resolutions, including holding committee
- 10 hearings [acting upon emergency appropriations, passing upon the
- 11 confirmation of the recess appointees of the Governor and such
- 12 emergency matters as may be submitted by the Governor in special
- 13 messages to the Legislature]. During the remainder of the session
- 14 [succeeding thirty days of the regular session of the Legislature]
- 15 the various committees of each House shall hold hearings to
- 16 consider all bills and resolutions and other matters then pending
- 17 and [; and such emergency matters as may be submitted by the
- 18 Governor. During the remainder of the session] the Legislature
- 19 shall act upon such bills and resolutions as may be then pending.
- 20 The Legislature may at any time during a regular session consider
- 21 the confirmation of the recess appointees of the Governor and act on
- 22 <u>emergency appropriations</u> and [upon] such emergency matters as may
- 23 be submitted by the Governor in special messages to the
- 24 Legislature.

- 1 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 2 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 4, 2025.
- 3 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 4 proposition: "The constitutional amendment regarding the time
- 5 during which the legislature may act on bills or resolutions during
- 6 a regular session."
