RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Family and friends will forever carry with them the 2 memory of Jose Maria Longoria Sr., a prominent Starr County 3 educator and public servant, who passed away on May 2, 1980, at the 4 age of 73; and

WHEREAS, Born on June 20, 1906, and raised in La Grulla, Jose 5 Longoria was the son of Tristan and Guadalupe C. Longoria, who 6 7 instilled in him the importance of education from an early age; he went on to be named the salutatorian at San Diego High School in 8 1925, and he subsequently graduated with honors from Texas A&I 9 University in 1933; he and both of his siblings, Guadalupe and 10 11 Roberto, attended college at a time when few minorities were 12 enrolled; and

WHEREAS, During World War II, Mr. Longoria enlisted in the 13 14 U.S. armed forces and became an army instructor in 1944; he had previously taught Spanish at Texas A&I University, and upon 15 16 returning from military service, he resumed his career as an educator in the San Isidro and Brownsville school districts; after 17 working as an editor for the Starr County Democrat for two years, he 18 took over as owner and manager of Valley Distributing Company, 19 20 operating the business from 1938 to 1974; along the way, he obtained 21 his law degree from La Salle Extension University; and

WHEREAS, A fiscal conservative, Mr. Longoria served as a county commissioner from 1949 to 1972; he also filled in as an interim county judge and volunteered as a trustee for the La Grulla

1 and Rio Grande City school districts; although the 1950s were an 2 economically challenging decade for Starr County, Mr. Longoria's 3 efforts helped to fund two new elementary schools; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Longoria was a charter member of LULAC as well as a member of the International Platform Association and the National Historical Society; he was the recipient of the Alpha Chi Award Plaque, and he was posthumously honored with a Presidential Memorial Certificate for his military service; and

9 WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, Mr. Longoria was blessed with 10 the love and support of his wife, Maria Saenz, and their six 11 children, Jose, Thelma, Isaac, Arturo, Romeo, and Roberto; in his 12 leisure hours, he found enjoyment in his favorite pastime, playing 13 the violin; and

14 WHEREAS, The life of Jose Longoria was an inspiring example 15 of the good that one person can accomplish, and he will forever hold 16 a special place in the hearts of those he left behind; now, 17 therefore, be it

18 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 89th Texas 19 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life and legacy of Jose Maria 20 Longoria Sr. and extend sincere condolences to his loved ones; and, 21 be it further

RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be prepared for his family and that when the Texas House of Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Jose Maria Longoria Sr.
