RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Our communities draw immeasurable strength from 2 individuals such as Frances Northcutt of Houston, who has 3 distinguished herself in the course of her exemplary career; and

WHEREAS, A graduate of The University of Texas, "Poppy" 4 5 Northcutt joined TRW Systems, a NASA contractor, in 1965, and she accepted an assignment to work as a computational aide at Johnson 6 7 Space Center; admired and respected for her skill, determination, and professionalism, she eventually received a promotion to the 8 technical team and became the first woman to serve in an operational 9 support role at NASA's Mission Control Center; some of her most 10 11 notable career highlights include calculating the return-to-Earth 12 trajectories for the Apollo 8 mission and receiving the Presidential Medal of Freedom as part of the team that rescued the 13 14 Apollo 13 astronauts; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Northcutt continued to work as an engineer while 15 16 studying law at the University of Houston, and she received her juris doctor in 1981; over the years, she served as the first felony 17 prosecutor in the domestic violence unit at the Harris County 18 District Attorney's Office, and she clerked for a federal appellate 19 20 judge in Alabama; she also prosecuted and later defended numerous 21 criminal cases, and after entering private practice, she specialized in criminal trial and appellate work; today, she is a 22 23 referral lawyer for Jane's Due Process, a nonprofit that provides legal assistance to pregnant minors; and 24

dedicated 1 WHEREAS, А advocate for women's rights, Ms. Northcutt serves as president of the Houston Area and Texas 2 3 State chapters of the National Organization for Women, and she is a former member of the organization's national board of directors; in 4 5 addition, she was the founding chair of the Harris County Women's Political Caucus, and she was named the first women's advocate for 6 the City of Houston; she has also served as a special conference 7 8 consultant for the National Women's Conference; along the way, she has volunteered at polling locations, and she currently serves as 9 10 an election judge; and

11 WHEREAS, A renowned trailblazer for women in engineering, 12 Poppy Northcutt made history through her contributions to the 13 Apollo program, and she has benefited her fellow citizens through a 14 lifetime of purposeful endeavor that continues to inspire all those 15 who know her; now, therefore, be it

16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 89th Texas 17 Legislature hereby honor Frances "Poppy" Northcutt for her 18 professional and civic achievements and extend to her sincere best 19 wishes for continued success in all her endeavors; and, be it 20 further

RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be prepared for Ms. Northcutt as an expression of high regard by the Texas House of Representatives.
