1 WHEREAS, Alief Early College High School in Houston has been
2 named a 2024 National Blue Ribbon School, one of the most
3 prestigious designations an elementary or secondary school in the
4 United States can receive; and

5 WHEREAS, The National Blue Ribbon Schools Program was created
6 by the U.S. Department of Education in 1982 to recognize campuses
7 that have demonstrated superior academic performance or made
8 notable progress in improving outcomes among economically
9 disadvantaged students; Alief Early College High School was one of
10 only 356 public and private schools nationwide and 31 schools in
11 Texas to have earned this impressive honor in 2024; and

12 WHEREAS, Established in 2009, Alief Early College High School
13 serves more than 400 students in 9th through 12th grade, and the
14 school was previously named a National Blue Ribbon School in 2016;
15 this exemplary institution has benefited from the able leadership
16 of its principal at the time of nomination, Dr. Brandi Brotherton
17 Ed.D., and its current principal, Matthew Skiles; and

18 WHEREAS, Through hard work and perseverance, the teachers and
19 students of Alief Early College High School have established a
20 record of scholastic excellence, and their outstanding efforts have
21 been duly recognized with the Blue Ribbon School award; now,
22 therefore, be it

24 Legislature hereby congratulate Alief Early College High School on
