R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Denton County lost an admired civic leader with the
2 passing of Jill Diane Warrington Glover of Double Oak on January 14,
3 2024, at the age of 63; and

4 WHEREAS, The daughter of Nancy and Forrest Warrington, the
5 former Jill Warrington was born in Palestine, Texas, on October 10,
6 1960; after completing her master's degree in psychology at Stephen
7 F. Austin State University, she worked for Texas State Mental
8 Health Services in Longview; she went on to establish a private
9 practice in Dallas focused on helping women with eating disorders
10 and abuse trauma; in addition, she taught at Dallas County
11 Community College and at Coram Deo Academy; and

12 WHEREAS, Mrs. Glover became a dedicated activist in the
13 grassroots conservative movement; she served her fellow Double Oak
14 residents as precinct chair, and as chair of the Legislative
15 Priorities Committee of the Republican Party of Texas, she kept a
16 strong focus on advancing the policies developed by thousands of
17 delegates from across the state; after becoming State Republican
18 Executive Committeewoman for Senate District 12 in 2018, she
19 regularly toured Texas to address hundreds of grassroots clubs; she
20 advocated energetically for voters and the Republican Party
21 platform and worked tirelessly to educate citizens about the
22 importance of political engagement at the local and state level;
23 She strongly advocated for legislation that would end the practice
24 of pediatric gender modification in the State of Texas and saw it

1 pass into law in 2023; and

2 WHEREAS, A woman of deep faith, Mrs. Glover mentored many
3 people, and she brought joy to all she encountered through her
4 warmth, humor, and encouragement; in all her endeavors, she enjoyed
5 the love and support of her husband, Curtis, and she was the proud
6 mother of a son, Nicholas; and

7 WHEREAS, Jill Glover selflessly devoted her time and talents
8 to the conservative cause, and although she is deeply missed by all
9 who were privileged to share in her love and friendship, her
10 exceptional contributions continue to resonate; now, therefore, be
11 it

12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 89th Texas
13 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Jill Diane Warrington
14 Glover and extend sincere condolences to the members of her family:
15 to her husband, Curtis Glover; to her son, Nicholas Glover; to her
16 brothers, David and Dennis Warrington; and to her other relatives
17 and friends; and, be it further
