RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, February 24, 2026, marks the 190th anniversary of 2 Lieutenant Colonel William Barrett Travis's letter from the Alamo, providing a fitting opportunity to acknowledge the enduring legacy 3 of his request for aid during the fight for Texas independence; and 4 5 WHEREAS, In 1836, Lieutenant Colonel William B. Travis led 150 Texas rebels in their brave stand at the Alamo against the 6 vastly greater forces of Mexican General Antonio López de Santa 7 Anna; on February 24, the second day of the siege, Colonel Travis 8 penned a letter addressed "to the people of Texas and all Americans 9 in the world," conveying that his valiant band was surrounded by a 10 11 thousand enemy soldiers demanding surrender, and he warned that the 12 fort was under continual bombardment and that enemy numbers were increasing; calling urgently for reinforcements, he acknowledged 13 14 the grave peril of the situation, closing with the defiant words "Victory or Death"; and 15 WHEREAS, Colonel Travis entrusted the letter to Captain 16 Albert Martin of Gonzales; the following day, Captain Martin passed 17 the dispatch on to Lancelot Smither, who departed for San Felipe on 18 the cold and windy evening; Mr. Smither delivered the missive to 19 the town's citizens committee within 40 hours; although several 20 21 copies were made, and the letter was published in newspapers as early as March 2, little help reached the defenders of the Alamo; 22 23 General Santa Anna's troops broke through on March 6, and Colonel Travis died alongside all of his men; and 24

- 1 WHEREAS, Shortly after the Texas Revolution, the original
- 2 letter was presented to the Travis family; a great-grandson of
- 3 Colonel Travis, John G. Davidson, sold the letter for \$85 in 1893 to
- 4 the Texas Department of Agriculture, Insurance, Statistics, and
- 5 History; this was the predecessor agency to the Texas State Library
- 6 and Archives Commission, which maintains stewardship of the
- 7 significant artifact today; and
- 8 WHEREAS, One of the most famous epistles in American history,
- 9 the William B. Travis letter is a testament to the love of liberty
- 10 and spirit of sacrifice that exemplified the Texas Revolution, and
- 11 the noble phrase "Victory or Death" will continue to inspire Texans
- 12 in generations to come; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 89th Texas
- 14 Legislature hereby commemorate the 190th anniversary of Lieutenant
- 15 Colonel William B. Travis's letter from the Alamo and commend the
- 16 Texas State Library and Archives Commission for its preservation;
- 17 and, be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
- 19 prepared for the commission as an expression of high regard by the
- 20 Texas House of Representatives.
