## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Proud residents of Montague County are gathering in
Austin on February 18, 2025, in celebration of Montague County Day
at the State Capitol; and

WHEREAS, Situated on the Red River in the Western Cross 4 Timbers of North Central Texas, this region was originally 5 inhabited by the Comanche, Wichita, and Kiowa Indians; in 1858, the 6 7 county was organized from portions of Cooke County and named for Daniel Montague, surveyor of the Fannin Land District and veteran 8 9 of the Mexican War; when federal troops withdrew from the area during the Civil War, Indian raids caused the population to decline 10 11 until the 1870s, when an organized effort was made to drive native 12 tribes from the county; by the early 1880s, the population had grown to 11,000 people; and 13

14 WHEREAS, An abundance of grasslands attracted cattlemen to the region in the 1860s, and the emergence of large cattle ranches 15 16 subsequently brought railroads to the county; by 1892, it was home to three rail systems that contributed to the area's growth and 17 development as a center for agribusiness; in the early years, the 18 county's economy was dominated by cattle ranching and cotton 19 production, and in the 20th century, it expanded to incorporate 20 21 other crops, as well as oil and gas production; and

22 WHEREAS, Today, Montague County is home to more than 20,000 23 people, and its economy benefits from the retail, health care, and 24 educational services industries; notable communities include the

county seat of Montague, as well as Saint Jo, Bowie, and Nocona, 1 where the Nocona Boot Company was established in 1887; residents 2 and visitors alike benefit from the recreational opportunities 3 afforded by Lake Nocona and Amon G. Carter Lake, and outdoor 4 enthusiasts are drawn to the area for activities such as boating, 5 6 fishing, and hunting; it also hosts a number of annual events, among 7 them the Chisholm Trail Rodeo, the Jim Bowie Days Rodeo, and the 8 Chicken and Bread Days Heritage Festival; and

9 WHEREAS, The people of Montague County take great pride in 10 their rich history as they work together to build an even brighter 11 future, and it is indeed fitting to honor them for their unique 12 contributions to the Lone Star State; now, therefore, be it

13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 89th Texas 14 Legislature hereby recognize February 18, 2025, as Montague County 15 Day at the State Capitol and extend a warm welcome to the visiting 16 delegation.
