1 WHEREAS, The family and friends of Cecile Richards, who 2 passed away on January 20, 2025, at the age of 67, may find comfort 3 in reflecting on her remarkable life's journey; and WHEREAS, Born in Waco on July 15, 1957, Cecile Richards was 4 5 the daughter of Ann Richards, who later served as the governor of Texas, and David Richards, a civil rights attorney; following in 6 7 her parents' footsteps, she took up political activism while still a teenager and was disciplined by her high school for protesting the 8

9 Vietnam War; after earning her degree from Brown University in 1980, she became a labor organizer; she later founded the Texas 10

Freedom Network, a progressive grassroots organization, and served 11 12

as deputy chief of staff to U.S. Representative Nancy Pelosi; and 13 WHEREAS, In 2006, Ms. Richards was appointed president of the 14 Planned Parenthood Federation of America, and she also served as president of the Planned Parenthood Action Fund; in those roles, 15 16 she became one of the leading voices in the debate over reproductive health, and throughout her 12-year tenure, she valiantly upheld the 17 importance of the organization's services and defended the rights 18

of the women and families that it served; and 19 20 WHEREAS, After concluding her service with Planned 21 Parenthood in 2018, Ms. Richards founded Supermajority, organization dedicated to encouraging more women to enter politics, 22 23 and published a memoir, Make Trouble: Standing Up, Speaking Out,

and Finding the Courage to Lead; in 2024, she was presented with a 24

- 1 Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian honor,
- 2 by President Joe Biden; she is survived by her husband, Kirk Adams,
- 3 her children, Lily, Hannah, and Daniel, a grandchild, and her
- 4 siblings, Ellen, Clark, and Dan Richards; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Though it is impossible to gauge the full effect of
- 6 one person's life, some individuals leave their unmistakable mark
- 7 on the world as they move through it, and the exceptional
- 8 contributions of Cecile Richards will continue to resonate for
- 9 years to come; now, therefore, be it
