## RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Port Freeport is celebrating the 100th anniversary
- 2 of its founding in 2025; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The port traces its history to the early 1820s, when
- 4 Stephen F. Austin first recognized the potential of the Brazos
- 5 River as a deep-water port and selected the area for his own colony;
- 6 over the years, the region became a hub for economic activity, and
- 7 following a recommendation from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers,
- 8 the Brazoria County Commissioners Court held an election to
- 9 establish the Brazos River Harbor Navigation District, to divert
- 10 the Brazos River and construct a bridge over the Diversion Channel;
- 11 the district was officially established in December 1925, and the
- 12 Diversion Channel was completed four years later; the first public
- 13 dock facilities were constructed in 1936; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Following the passage of Texas House Bill 542 in
- 15 2007, the Brazos River Harbor Navigation District was renamed Port
- 16 Freeport; since its inception, the port has grown to become a
- 17 strategic gateway for international trade, ranking among the top
- 18 ports in the United States for foreign waterborne export tonnage;
- 19 in addition, the port is one of the largest petrochemical and energy
- 20 ports in the nation and encompasses facilities for top leaders in
- 21 the chemical, crude oil, gases, agriculture, and automobile
- 22 industries; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Port Freeport has significantly contributed to the
- 24 state and national economy, generating an annual economic impact of

- \$157.3 billion and sustaining more than 266,000 jobs nationwide; 1 the port has driven economic growth through infrastructure 2 3 investments such as the Freeport Harbor Channel Improvement Project, which is scheduled for completion in 2025; the \$295 4 5 million project includes the widening and deepening of the Freeport Harbor Channel to depths ranging from 51 to 56 feet, making it the 6 deepest port in Texas; moreover, in September 2024, the Port 7 8 Freeport Commission voted to adopt a zero-tax rate, enabling the port to operate as a self-reliant entity with no tax assessment; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Over the past century, Port Freeport has played an important role in the economic vitality of the State of Texas, 11 steadfast commitment to 12 demonstrating а sustainability, innovation, and operational excellence, and it is indeed fitting to 13 14 join the people of Brazoria County in celebrating this important
- milestone in the port's rich history; now, therefore, be it
  RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 89th Texas
- 17 Legislature hereby commemorate the 100th anniversary of Port
- 18 Freeport and extend to all those affiliated with the port sincere
- 19 best wishes for continued success; and, be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
- 21 prepared for Port Freeport as an expression of high regard by the
- 22 Texas House of Representatives.
