R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The Honorable Rose Guerra Reyna is retiring as judge
2 of the 206th District Court on December 31, 2026, concluding her
3 tenure as the longest-serving woman in that role; and

4 WHEREAS, Rose Reyna first took office as judge of the 206th
5 District Court in 1999, and she has since presided over numerous
6 civil, family, felony, and juvenile cases for the court, which
7 serves Hidalgo County; and

8 WHEREAS, A native of the Rio Grande Valley, Judge Reyna
9 earned her bachelor's degree from Pan American University and her
10 juris doctor degree from The University of Texas School of Law; she
11 began her career in private practice, working for the Law Offices of
12 Ramon Garcia before moving to Skaggs, Reyna & Garza, L.L.P., where
13 she was a partner for 11 years; and

14 WHEREAS, Judge Reyna has contributed to her professional
15 community as a member of several statewide task forces, as a
16 multidistrict litigation judge, and as presiding judge of the
17 Hidalgo County Re-entry Court; in addition, she has been involved
18 in various nonprofit organizations, and she has received numerous
19 accolades in recognition of her efforts, including the 2010 Texas
20 Center Professionalism Award from the Hidalgo County Bar
21 Association and the Texas Center for Legal Ethics; in all her
22 endeavors, she enjoys the love and support of her sons, Josh and
23 Anthony Reyna; and

24 WHEREAS, For more than a quarter century, Judge Reyna's

1 dedication, expertise, and commitment to justice have greatly
2 benefited citizens across the Lone Star State, and she may indeed
3 reflect with pride on her many achievements; now, therefore, be it

4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 89th Texas
5 Legislature hereby congratulate the Honorable Rose Guerra Reyna on
6 her retirement from the 206th District Court and extend to her
7 sincere best wishes for the future; and, be it further
