RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Proud residents of Coppell are gathering in Austin 2 to celebrate Coppell Day at the State Capitol on March 5, 2025; and 3 WHEREAS, The first known settler in what was originally called Grapevine Springs was James Parish, who moved to the area in 4 5 the mid-1800s; in time, a farming community developed, and it was renamed Gibbs in honor of Barnett Gibbs, a Dallas lawyer, civic 6 leader, politician, and local real estate investor; strongly 7 supported by the state's farmers, Mr. Gibbs served in the 1880s as 8 9 lieutenant governor; the young town acquired rail connections in 1888 with the arrival of the St. Louis, Arkansas and Texas Railway, 10 11 and in the early 1890s, it was renamed Coppell, in honor of New York 12 financier George Coppell, who had provided crucial assistance to the rail line; the city incorporated in 1955; and 13 14 WHEREAS, Coppell today is home to more than 2,000 businesses, including almost 30 corporate headquarters and nearly a dozen 15 16 Fortune 500 companies; the Coppell Chamber of Commerce advocates for businesses at the local, state, and national levels and serves 17 as a valuable resource for training, networking, and educational 18 opportunities; moreover, the city boasts a thriving residential 19 20 community that enjoys excellent services, exemplary parks, and safe 21 neighborhoods, and it benefits from its central location at the heart of the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex, only 5 miles from DFW 22 23 International Airport and 30 minutes from both Dallas and Fort Worth; and 24

1 WHEREAS, In recent years, the city was honored with consecutive National Gold Medal Awards by the National Recreation 2 3 and Park Association, a Certificate of Achievement for Excellence Financial Reporting by the Government Finance Officers 4 5 Association, and a Certificate of Distinction by the Government Treasurers' Organization of Texas, in addition to receiving AAA 6 bond ratings from both Moody's and S&P Global and a Certificate of 7 8 Achievement from the Richard R. Lillie, FAICP Planning Excellence Recognition Program of the Texas Chapter of the American Planning 9 10 Association; it was also ranked 25th among the 100 Best Fleets in the Americas by NAFA Fleet Management Association in 2022, and it 11 12 was recognized as a National Night Out winner in 2024, placing third in the nation among similarly sized cities that participated in the 13 14 campaign; and

15 WHEREAS, Coppell Independent School District, a premier public school system with high-performing schools, is home to more 16 17 than 13,000 students, who represent a wide range of countries, languages, and cultural and ethnic backgrounds; the district is 18 19 committed to creating profound learning experiences for each child and focuses on themes of collective engagement, great teaching, 20 authentic relationships, and redefining success; and 21

WHEREAS, Residents of Coppell are building on their past achievements as they work toward an even brighter future, and it is 23 indeed fitting to take this opportunity to honor them; now, 25 therefore, be it
