1 WHEREAS, The observance of Collin College Day at the State
2 Capitol on March 13, 2025, offers a welcome opportunity to honor
3 this noteworthy institution as it celebrates its 40th anniversary;
4 and

5 WHEREAS, Founded in 1985, Collin College held its first
6 classes at local high schools; it has steadily expanded to meet the
7 needs of the region, which now ranks among the fastest-growing in
8 the nation; today, the institution serves more than 60,000 students
9 at 10 campuses, including the iCollin Virtual Campus; and

10 WHEREAS, Collin College has developed its programs in
11 response to the diverse needs of the community; it offers over 200
12 degree and certificate programs, including baccalaureate degrees
13 in clinical operations management, construction management,
14 cybersecurity, and nursing, as well as workforce programs designed
15 to prepare students for high-wage, high-demand careers; and

16 WHEREAS, While promoting academic excellence, Collin College
17 has maintained the lowest in-district tuition in the state, has
18 among the highest student success rates, and has gained national
19 recognition for affordability; as a community-centered
20 institution, it also strives to foster innovation, character, and a
21 tradition of service; and

22 WHEREAS, The institution has successfully cultivated a
23 vibrant student life; its active Student Government Association has
24 received numerous accolades as a member of the Texas Junior College

1 Student Government Association, Region II; moreover, the robust
2 athletics program encompasses both men's and women's basketball,
3 tennis, esports, and golf; in 2024, the Lady Cougars won the
4 National Junior College Athletic Association Region V Tournament
5 for the first time in the college's history and went on to compete
6 in the national tournament; the men's basketball team captured the
7 2024 title in the North Texas Junior College Athletic Conference;
8 and

9 WHEREAS, Committed to increasing access to higher education,
10 Collin College has provided generations of students with pathways
11 to advancement over the course of four decades, and it is a pleasure
12 to mark this significant milestone in the school's history; now,
13 therefore, be it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 89th Texas
15 Legislature hereby recognize March 13, 2025, as Collin College Day
16 at the State Capitol and extend a warm welcome to the visiting
17 delegation.
