RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Residents of Houston lost a tireless champion of 2 opportunity and positive change with the passing of Congressman 3 Sylvester Turner on March 5, 2025, at the age of 70; and

WHEREAS, A former mayor of the city and a longtime member of 4 5 the Texas Legislature, Sylvester Turner was born in Houston on September 27, 1954, and grew up with eight siblings in a two-bedroom 6 house in the Acres Homes neighborhood; while watching the 7 Kennedy-Nixon debates with his family as a small boy, he resolved to 8 become a lawyer and public servant, beginning his lifelong 9 commitment to helping others; his father, a commercial painter, 10 11 died when he was just 13, and his mother continued to support the 12 family as a housekeeper at the Rice Hotel; although neither of his parents received a diploma, he became student body president and 13 14 valedictorian at Klein High School, and he went on to graduate from the University of Houston and Harvard Law School; and 15

16 WHEREAS, Congressman Turner began his career as a trial 17 lawyer with the Fulbright & Jaworski firm and later cofounded 18 Barnes & Turner, a practice focused on commercial law and personal 19 injury litigation; in addition, he taught at the Texas Southern 20 University Thurgood Marshall School of Law, at the South Texas 21 College of Law, and in the University of Houston Law School 22 continuing legal education program; and

23 WHEREAS, First elected to the Texas House of Representatives 24 in 1988, Congressman Turner was reelected 13 times and served three

1 terms as speaker pro tempore; he helped shape fiscal policy during more than two decades on the House Appropriations Committee and 2 3 multiple terms as chair of its Subcommittee on Criminal Justice; moreover, he distinguished himself in his duties as a member of the 4 5 Legislative Budget Board and as chair of the Texas Legislative Black Caucus and the Greater Houston Area Legislative Delegation; 6 known for his eloquence and his ability to work across the aisle, he 7 8 secured passage of such important legislation as a 2007 children's health insurance measure; his passion for health care, education, 9 10 human services, consumer rights, and juvenile justice earned him recognition as "the conscience of the House"; and 11

WHEREAS, Congressman Turner was elected to the first of two 12 terms as Houston mayor in 2015; he guided the city through a period 13 14 of unprecedented challenges, among them Hurricane Harvey and six 15 other federally declared disasters, as well as the COVID-19 pandemic; early in his tenure, he strengthened finances by crafting 16 17 a solution for the mounting pension debt crisis; he also promoted sustainability, bolstering the city's status as the energy capital 18 19 of the world; addressing violent crime and mental health, he launched the One Safe Houston initiative, and other important 20 programs included Hire Houston Youth, One Clean Houston, and 21 Complete Communities, which fostered economic advancement through 22 revitalization of underserved areas; in addition to his other 23 24 responsibilities, he provided national leadership in urban policy as chair of the Global Resilient Cities Network, Climate Mayors, 25 26 and the African American Mayors Association, and he was a trustee of the U.S. Conference of Mayors; and 27

WHEREAS, In 2024, citizens elected him to Congress to 1 the historically significant 18th Congressional 2 represent 3 District, and he served as a member of the Homeland Security and the Science, Space, and Technology Committees; during his time in 4 5 office, he maintained the incomparable work ethic and whirlwind pace that defined his entire career, devoting himself to the 6 lawmaking process, staying in close touch with constituents, and 7 8 participating in numerous neighborhood and community-wide events in Houston; he also set aside time to attend the Church Without 9 Walls, where he worshipped for well over three decades, and he 10 rarely missed a Sunday service, even while undergoing cancer 11 treatment; he was a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, 12 Incorporated, and remained a proud resident of the Acres Homes 13 14 community where he grew up; and

15 WHEREAS, Intent on fulfilling his mission until the very 16 last, Sylvester Turner made an enduring, positive difference in the 17 lives of millions of Texans through his transformative public 18 service, and although his loss is deeply felt, his extraordinary 19 contributions will continue to resonate in the years to come; now, 20 therefore, be it

21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 89th Texas 22 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of the Honorable 23 Sylvester Turner and extend sincere condolences to the members of 24 his family: to his daughter, Ashley Turner Captain, and her 25 husband, Jimmie; to his grandson, Jameson Captain; to his other 26 relatives and a host of friends and colleagues; and to all who mourn 27 his passing; and, be it further
