RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Proud residents of Carrizo Springs are gathering in 2 Austin on March 31, 2025, in celebration of Carrizo Springs Day at

3 the State Capitol; and

WHEREAS, The oldest settlement in Dimmit County, Carrizo 4 5 Springs was named by Spanish explorers for its springs and for the cane grass that grew around them; the town was founded in 1865 by a 6 7 group of 15 families from Atascosa County, led by Levi English, with additional settlers arriving from Goliad two years later; as the 8 9 largest and most established community in the area, it was designated the county seat when Dimmit County was organized in 10 11 1880, and that same year, Mr. English donated a parcel of land for a 12 townsite; the 1880s brought the construction of homes and key infrastructure, including the first schoolhouse, which was built by 13 14 a local Masonic group, the courthouse, and the establishment of The Carrizo Springs Javelin newspaper; by the end of the century, the 15 16 thriving community was home to churches, grocery stores, a livery stable, and various other businesses; and 17

WHEREAS, In its early years, the town's economy was driven by sheep and cattle ranching, but after the discovery of artesian water as a cost-effective irrigation source, agriculture became the primary industry, attracting new settlers and increasing land values; in 1910, the San Antonio, Uvalde and Gulf Railroad opened a spur into Carrizo Springs, and the community officially incorporated that year; despite periods of economic downturn,

- 1 subsequent decades saw continued growth and infrastructure
- 2 improvements, including the paving of the business district in the
- 3 late 1920s; and
- WHEREAS, Today, Carrizo Springs has a population of 4,800 and
- 5 its economy benefits from the mining, oil and gas, transportation,
- 6 and hospitality industries; residents and visitors alike can enjoy
- 7 Veterans Park as well as outdoor activities afforded by nearby
- 8 lakes and the Nueces River; in addition, the city boasts such
- 9 historic landmarks as the Dimmit County Courthouse and First
- 10 Baptist Church; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Celebrating their rich history as they work to build
- 12 an even brighter future, the citizens of Carrizo Springs are
- 13 justifiably proud of their community, and it is indeed fitting to
- 14 honor their contributions to the story of the Lone Star State; now,
- 15 therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 89th Texas
- 17 Legislature hereby recognize March 31, 2025, as Carrizo Springs Day
- 18 at the State Capitol and extend a warm welcome to the visiting
- 19 delegation.
