## RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, A life dedicated to the pursuit of social justice 2 and human rights drew to a close with the passing of Daniel Chris 3 Graney of San Antonio on July 11, 2024, at the age of 75; and WHEREAS, Born on May 16, 1949, in Norfolk, Nebraska, Dan 4 5 Graney spent part of his youth in foster care before being adopted by a Lutheran minister and his wife at age 18; after graduating from 6 7 St. John's College in Winfield, Kansas, he received his undergraduate degree from Concordia Senior College in Fort Wayne, 8 9 Indiana, and his master of divinity degree from
- 11 clerical career serving San Francisco's Mission District Hispanic

Seminary-Seminex; ordained as a Lutheran minister, he began his

- WHEREAS, While undertaking his ministerial studies,
- 14 Mr. Graney met his first love, a Franciscan priest named Roberto
- 15 Flores; in 1977, the pair moved to Houston, where Mr. Graney served
- 16 as a minister and paralegal for undocumented immigrants; he was
- 17 elected as a bishop of the Texas Province of the Southwest Regional
- 18 Synod of Evangelical Lutheran Churches, but he was forced to resign
- 19 after church officials learned about his relationship; pivoting to
- 20 a career in law, he graduated as valedictorian of his class at Texas
- 21 Southern University's Thurgood Marshall School of Law in 1987, and
- 22 he went on to relocate his practice, which primarily focused on
- 23 immigration law, to San Antonio in 1992; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Graney and Mr. Flores shared 35 years together

- 1 before they were able to legally marry in Vermont on October 15,
- 2 2009; after Mr. Flores passed away, Mr. Graney was fortunate enough
- 3 to find love again, and on June 9, 2017, he wed Rolando Jaimes
- 4 Mesco, who served as his devoted caregiver throughout his medical
- 5 challenges; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Despite retiring from his work as an attorney due to
- 7 health issues in 1993, Mr. Graney continued to make an impact
- 8 through his involvement with San Antonio's LGBT community; he
- 9 served as cofounder of the Stonewall Democrats of San Antonio, as
- 10 chair of the Bexar County Democratic Party, and as president of the
- 11 Stonewall Democratic Caucus for the 2008 Texas Democratic Party
- 12 Convention; additionally, as co-chair of the Community Alliance for
- 13 a United San Antonio, he helped secure the historic passage of a
- 14 citywide nondiscrimination ordinance in 2013; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Dan Graney touched countless lives through his
- 16 selfless service and his unwavering commitment to the rights of the
- 17 marginalized, and he leaves behind a legacy that will long be
- 18 remembered; now, therefore, be it
- 19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 89th Texas
- 20 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of Daniel Chris Graney
- 21 and extend deepest condolences to all those who mourn his passing;
- 22 and, be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
- 24 prepared for his family and that when the Texas House of
- 25 Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Dan Graney.
