1 WHEREAS, Residents of Mission lost an admired civic leader 2 and a friend to many with the passing of Benjamin Cavazos on 3 March 8, 2025, at the age of 94; and

WHEREAS, The son of Poulina Sepulveda, Ben Cavazos was born 4 5 in Sharyland on May 5, 1930; he graduated from Sharyland High School and received specialized training in the U.S. Army; after working 6 for Cameron Electric in McAllen, he cofounded Mission Auto 7 Electric, and he soon bought out his partner; the company 8 9 flourished, becoming MAE Power Equipment on its 50th anniversary in 10 2004; over the years, Mr. Cavazos mentored countless employees, as 11 well as customers who started lawn care businesses, and he was 12 founder and charter president of the Texas Service Dealers 13 Organization; and

14 WHEREAS, In 1965, Mr. Cavazos joined the Mission Chamber of Commerce, and today, MAE Power Equipment is its longest-tenured 15 member; he was also a founder of the Citrus Cavaliers, who served as 16 city ambassadors with the chamber; during more than a half century 17 with the Mission Kiwanis Club, he was its announcer for the Texas 18 Citrus Fiesta Parade and served several terms as president; in 19 20 addition, he was a member of the Mission Jaycees, and he served on the Mission hospital board for almost two decades; as a parishioner 21 of Saint Paul Catholic Church, he was active in the Cursillo 22 23 Movement and the men's group; he received myriad accolades for his contributions, including selection as the 1980 City of Mission Man 24

of the Year, as the 1984 Mr. Mission, and as the 2019 Business 1 Leader of the Year by the Greater Mission Chamber of Commerce; and 2 WHEREAS, Mr. Cavazos and his first wife, Margarita Cuevas, 3 became the proud parents of three children, Benjamin, Joe, and 4 5 Teresa; following the amicable end of their union, he was fortunate enough to find love a second time, and he married Rita Cavazos in 6 1968; they were blessed with two children, Martha and Oscar; 7 8 Mr. Cavazos loved family road trips and always brought home wonderful stories, and he considered any occasion a good reason for 9 10 a party; and
