## RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, The State of Texas is proud of its diverse
- 2 communities built on shared values of liberty, faith, and
- 3 patriotism; and
- WHEREAS, All communities are important to Texas, and we honor
- 5 those who contribute to the strength, culture, and prosperity of
- 6 our state; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The Council on American-Islamic Relations has been
- 8 credibly linked to terrorist organizations such as Hamas and the
- 9 Muslim Brotherhood, both enemies of the United States and threats
- 10 to our way of life; CAIR's leadership has openly praised acts of
- 11 terror, defended violence against innocent civilians, and shown
- 12 contempt for American allies such as Israel; and
- WHEREAS, The Federal Bureau of Investigation has suspended
- 14 all formal contacts with the Council on American-Islamic Relations
- 15 due to evidence demonstrating a relationship between CAIR and
- 16 Hamas; Hamas is designated as a foreign terrorist organization by
- 17 the United States Department of State and perpetrated the brutal
- 18 attack on the State of Israel on October 7, 2023, in which Hamas
- 19 indiscriminately killed more than 1,200 innocent people, including
- 20 Israelis, Americans, and other nationals, and took more than 240
- 21 civilians as hostages; and
- WHEREAS, In the federal criminal prosecutions of persons
- 23 involved with the Holy Land Foundation for Relief and Development,
- 24 the largest successful prosecution of terrorism financing in our

- 1 country's history, CAIR was identified as an associate of the
- 2 Muslim Brotherhood and was named an unindicted co-conspirator in
- 3 the trial; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Soon after opening its first office in Washington,
- 5 D.C., CAIR received a grant from the Holy Land Foundation for Relief
- 6 and Development, a charitable organization that was closed and was
- 7 designated a Specially Designated Global Terrorist by the United
- 8 States Department of the Treasury for funding jihadist terrorist
- 9 organizations; and
- 10 WHEREAS, In 2009, Ghassan Elashi, who was a member of the
- 11 founding board of directors of the Texas branch of CAIR and a leader
- 12 of the Holy Land Foundation for Relief and Development, was
- 13 sentenced to a total of 65 years in prison after being convicted of
- 14 10 counts of conspiracy to provide, and the provision of, material
- 15 support to a designated foreign terrorist organization as well as
- 16 numerous other charges; and
- WHEREAS, Randall Todd Royer, also known as Ismail Royer, who
- 18 served as a communications specialist and civil rights coordinator
- 19 for CAIR, trained with and set up an Internet-based newsletter for
- 20 Lashkar-e-Taiba, an al Qaeda-tied Kashmir organization that is
- 21 listed on the United States Department of State's international
- 22 terror list; he was also indicted on charges of conspiring to help
- 23 al Qaeda and the Taliban battle American troops fighting in
- 24 Afghanistan and was sentenced to 20 years in prison on April 9,
- 25 2004; and
- WHEREAS, In September 2003, CAIR's former community affairs
- 27 director, Bassem Khafagi, pleaded guilty to three federal counts of

- 1 bank and visa fraud and agreed to be deported to Egypt after he had
- 2 funneled money to activities supporting terrorism and had published
- 3 material advocating suicide attacks against the United States,
- 4 illegal activities that took place while he was employed by CAIR;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, Rabih Haddad, the Ann Arbor, Michigan-based CAIR
- 7 fundraiser, was arrested on terrorism-related charges and was
- 8 deported from the United States due to his work as Executive
- 9 Director of the Global Relief Foundation, which in October 2002 was
- 10 closed by the United States Department of the Treasury for
- 11 financing al Qaeda and other terrorist organizations; and
- WHEREAS, It is a dangerous affront to the people of Texas to
- 13 allow any group that supports, sympathizes with, or excuses
- 14 terrorism to be welcomed or honored within the halls of our Capitol;
- 15 just as the Texas Capitol would never open its doors to groups such
- 16 as the Ku Klux Klan, to drug cartels, or to any other group that
- 17 promotes hatred and violence, it must not and will not open its
- 18 doors to CAIR; the ongoing Islamification of American communities
- 19 through extremist organizations represents one of the most urgent
- 20 cultural and security challenges facing our state today; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Texas has always stood firmly against enemies
- 22 foreign and domestic, rejecting any group that seeks to undermine
- 23 the Constitution, erode our freedoms, or endanger our families, and
- 24 it will never tolerate, support, or honor organizations aligned
- 25 with terrorism, hatred, or the enemies of the United States; now,
- 26 therefore, be it
