R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The girls' soccer team from Randall High School in
2 Amarillo closed out a historic year by winning the 2025 University
3 Interscholastic League 4A Division 2 state championship; and

4 WHEREAS, The Lady Raiders' journey to the title began with an
5 impressive regular-season run in which they clinched the district
6 crown; Randall then surged through the playoffs, dispatching
7 Bridgeport, San Elizario, Benbrook, and Godley High Schools in the
8 first four rounds; a 1-0 shutout of Aubrey in the state semifinal
9 earned the Lady Raiders a place in the championship matchup; and

10 WHEREAS, On April 10, Randall took the field against
11 Wimberley High School in what proved to be an epic battle;
12 demonstrating their resilience, the Lady Raiders tied the game 1-1
13 with four minutes left in the first half and took a 2-1 lead in the
14 43rd minute; Wimberley knotted the score 2-2 near the end of
15 regulation, and the foes remained deadlocked through two overtime
16 periods; triumphing by a 7-6 count in the penalty kick shootout, the
17 Lady Raiders claimed the program's first state title in thrilling
18 fashion, finishing with an outstanding record of 23-5-1; and

19 WHEREAS, Championship game Most Valuable Player Kyndal
20 McClain was joined by Ryan McClain, Lyla Williams, and Brooke
21 French on the All-Tournament Team; the Lady Raiders also received
22 valuable contributions throughout their campaign from the other
23 members of the roster: Rionna Macias, Yareli Ramos, Reese Davis, AJ
24 Villanueva, Brooklyn Alstead, Kyleigh McHugh, Brinley Haden, Grace

1 Simpson, Jess Ledesma, Rylee Bailey, Aliya Cude, Brooklyn Hussey,
2 Jani Contreras, Ryann Davis, Camilla Diaz, Alex Lopez, Kaylie
3 Kashuba, Kambree Thurman, Faith Saavedra, and Kenzi Brown; these
4 dedicated athletes were guided by head coach Whitney Bernard and
5 assistant coaches Aspen Connally and Stacy Ferguson, and they
6 enjoyed additional support from managers Monissa Sherali, Yareli
7 Cervantez, Adrianna Avalos, Kayli Brown, and Kolbie Borden; and

8 WHEREAS, The Randall Lady Raiders' championship victory
9 represents the culmination of countless hours of hard work and an
10 unwavering commitment to excellence, and the players and their many
11 supporters in the local community will treasure the memory of this
12 accomplishment for years to come; now, therefore, be it
