A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to a model suicide prevention policy, suicide prevention
3	and intervention strategies incorporated into a state agency crisis
4	or disaster plan, suicide death information maintained by the
5	Department of State Health Services, and the Texas Violent Death
6	Reporting System.
7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
8	SECTION 1. Chapter 547, Government Code, as effective April
9	1, 2025, is amended by adding Subchapter J to read as follows:
10	SUBCHAPTER J. SUICIDE PREVENTION
11	Sec. 547.0451. MODEL SUICIDE PREVENTION POLICY. (a) In
12	this section, "postvention" includes activities that promote
13	healing necessary to reduce the risk of suicide by an individual
14	affected by the suicide of another individual.
15	(b) The commission shall develop and publish on the
16	commission's Internet website a model suicide prevention policy to
17	be implemented at state agencies, community coalitions, and other
18	<pre>public or private institutions or facilities that serve populations</pre>
19	at higher risk for suicide, including veterans, individuals with
20	disabilities, and individuals who live in rural areas of this
21	state. The policy must be designed for implementation by
22	individuals who may not be mental health professionals.
23	(c) The policy must include:
24	(1) information on suicide prevention, intervention,

- 1 and postvention;
- 2 (2) information on recognizing warning signs of
- 3 suicide; and
- 4 <u>(3) resources</u>, including local mental health
- 5 authorities, for individuals at risk of suicide.
- 6 (d) The policy must address the development of community
- 7 coalitions to engage in suicide prevention, intervention, and
- 8 postvention activities, especially in high-risk rural areas of this
- 9 state.
- 10 (e) In developing the policy under this section, the
- 11 commission:
- 12 (1) shall collaborate with the statewide behavioral
- 13 health coordinating council established under Subchapter D and the
- 14 Texas Suicide Prevention Collaborative; and
- 15 (2) may receive information or assistance from any
- 16 other interested statewide or local entities engaged in suicide
- 17 prevention, intervention, and postvention.
- Sec. 547.0452. CRISIS AND DISASTER PLANS. (a) Not later
- 19 than August 31, 2026, the commission, in collaboration with the
- 20 Disaster Behavioral Health Consortium, shall:
- 21 (1) for the purpose of identifying opportunities to
- 22 <u>incorporate suicide prevention</u>, intervention, and postvention
- 23 strategies:
- 24 (A) conduct a review of crisis plans and disaster
- 25 plans of state agency consortium members; and
- 26 (B) identify lessons learned from responses by
- 27 state agency consortium members during prior crises or disasters;

- 2 (2) based on the information obtained under
- 3 Subdivision (1), recommend to each state agency consortium member
- 4 incorporating suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention
- 5 strategies into a crisis plan or disaster plan.
- 6 (b) Not later than August 1, 2027, each state agency member
- 7 of the Disaster Behavioral Health Consortium shall incorporate
- 8 recommendations the commission made under Subsection (a) into the
- 9 agency's crisis plan or disaster plan.
- 10 (c) This section expires September 1, 2027.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 191.002(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 (b) The department shall:
- 14 (1) establish a vital statistics unit in the
- 15 department with suitable offices that are properly equipped for the
- 16 preservation of its official records;
- 17 (2) establish a statewide system of vital statistics;
- 18 (3) provide instructions and prescribe forms for
- 19 collecting, recording, transcribing, compiling, and preserving
- 20 vital statistics;
- 21 (4) require the enforcement of this title and rules
- 22 adopted under this title;
- 23 (5) prepare, print, and supply to local registrars
- 24 forms for registering, recording, and preserving returns or
- 25 otherwise carrying out the purposes of this title; [and]
- 26 (6) propose legislation necessary for the purposes of
- 27 this title; and

- 1 (7) provide access to information regarding suicides
- 2 in this state to the statewide suicide prevention coordinator of
- 3 the Health and Human Services Commission's office of mental health
- 4 coordination.
- 5 SECTION 3. Subchapter D, Chapter 1001, Health and Safety
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Section 1001.090 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1001.090. TEXAS VIOLENT DEATH REPORTING SYSTEM. (a)
- 8 The department shall establish and operate the Texas Violent Death
- 9 Reporting System for the purpose of participating in the National
- 10 Violent Death Reporting System operated by the Centers for Disease
- 11 Control and Prevention.
- 12 (b) The department shall provide access to suicide data
- 13 obtained or maintained through the Texas Violent Death Reporting
- 14 System to the statewide suicide prevention coordinator of the
- 15 <u>commission's office of mental health coordination.</u>
- 16 <u>(c) The executive commissioner may adopt rules necessary to</u>
- 17 implement this section.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
