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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to fetal development instruction included as part of the 2 public school health curriculum in certain grade levels. 3 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by 5 6 adding Subsection (x) to read as follows: 7 (x) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules requiring students enrolled in grade levels seven and eight to receive 8 age-appropriate and medically accurate instruction on fetal 9 10 development as part of the essential knowledge and skills for the health curriculum required under Subsection (a)(2)(B). The board 11 may adopt rules requiring students enrolled in other grade levels 12 to receive age-appropriate and medically accurate instruction on 13 fetal development. The instruction must include: 14 15 (1) information on: (A) the human reproductive process, pregnancy, 16 17 and infertility; and (B) the prevention of birth defects, including 18 information on the effect of drugs, alcohol, and environmental 19 20 hazards such as lead; and 21 (2) a description of the growth and development of an 22 unborn child that occur during each trimester of pregnancy. SECTION 2. Section 28.004(c), Education Code, is amended to 23 24 read as follows:

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(c) The local school health advisory council's duties
 include recommending:

3 (1) the number of hours of instruction to be provided
4 in:

5 (A) health education in kindergarten through6 grade eight; and

7 (B) if the school district requires health
8 education for high school graduation, health education, including
9 physical health education and mental health education, in grades 9
10 through 12;

(2) policies, procedures, strategies, and curriculum appropriate for specific grade levels designed to prevent physical health concerns, including obesity, cardiovascular disease, Type 2 diabetes, and mental health concerns, including suicide, through coordination of:

16 (A) health education, which must address 17 physical health concerns and mental health concerns to ensure the 18 integration of physical health education and mental health 19 education;

physical education and physical activity; 20 (B) (C) nutrition services; 21 22 (D) parental involvement; instruction on substance abuse prevention; 23 (E) school health services, including mental 24 (F) 25 health services; a comprehensive school counseling program (G) 26 27 under Section 33.005;

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a safe and healthy school environment; and 1 (H) 2 (I)school employee wellness; (3) appropriate grade levels and 3 methods of 4 instruction for human sexuality instruction; 5 (4) strategies for integrating the curriculum components specified by Subdivision (2) with the following elements 6 7 in a coordinated school health program for the district: school health services, including physical 8 (A) 9 health services and mental health services, if provided at a campus by the district or by a third party under a contract with the 10 district; 11 a comprehensive school counseling program 12 (B) 13 under Section 33.005; a safe and healthy school environment; and 14 (C) 15 school employee wellness; (D) 16 (5) if feasible, joint use agreements or strategies for collaboration between the school district and community 17 organizations or agencies; 18 (6) strategies 19 to increase parental awareness 20 regarding: risky behaviors and early warning signs of 21 (A) 22 suicide risks and behavioral health concerns, including mental health disorders and substance use disorders; and 23 24 (B) available community programs and services 25 that address risky behaviors, suicide risks, and behavioral health 26 concerns; 27 (7) appropriate grade levels and curriculum for

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1 instruction regarding the dangers of opioids, including
2 instruction on:

(A) opioid addiction and 3 abuse, including 4 addiction to and abuse of synthetic opioids such as fentanyl; and 5 (B) methods of administering an opioid antagonist, as defined by Section 483.101, Health and Safety Code; 6 7 [and]

(8) appropriate grade levels and curriculum 8 for 9 instruction regarding child abuse, family violence, dating violence, and sex trafficking, including likely warning signs that 10 11 a child may be at risk for sex trafficking, provided that the local school health advisory council's recommendations under this 12 subdivision do not conflict with the essential knowledge and skills 13 developed by the State Board of Education under this subchapter; 14 15 and

16 (9) appropriate curriculum for the instruction on 17 fetal development described by Section 28.002(x), provided that the 18 local school health advisory council's recommendations under this 19 subdivision do not conflict with the essential knowledge and skills 20 developed by the State Board of Education under this subchapter.

21 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026 22 school year.

23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
