A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-21 relating to fetal development instruction included as part of the 1-22 1-23 public school health curriculum in certain grade levels.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by 1-24 1-25 adding Subsection (x) to read as follows:

The State Board of Education shall adopt rules requiring 1-26 (x) students enrolled in grade levels seven and eight to receive instruction on fetal development as part of the essential knowledge 1-27 1-28 and skills for the health curriculum required under Subsection 1-29 1-30 (a)(2)(B). The board may adopt rules requiring students enrolled in other grade levels to receive instruction on fetal development. The instruction must include: 1-31 1-32 1 - 33

information on: (1)

the human reproductive process, pregnancy, 1-34 (A) 1-35 and infertility; and

(B) the prevention of birth defects, including information on the effect of drugs, alcohol, and environmental hazards such as lead; and 1-36 1-37 1-38

1-39 (2) a description of the growth and development of an unborn child that occur during each trimester of pregnancy. 1-40

1-41 SECTION 2. Section 28.004(c), Education Code, is amended to 1-42 read as follows:

SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026 2-55 2-56 2-57 school year. 2-58 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 2-59 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2-60 2-61 Act takes effect September 1, 2025. 2-62

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
