2	relating to prohibiting insurers from requiring the tying of

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 551, Insurance Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter F to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER F. CONTINGENCY OF RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY AND PERSONAL
8	AUTOMOBILE POLICIES
9	Sec. 551.251. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "residential
10	property insurance" and "personal automobile insurance" have the
11	meanings assigned by Section 38.002, Insurance Code.
12	Sec. 551.252. APPLICABILITY OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter
13	applies to an authorized insurer writing property and casualty
14	insurance in this state, including:
15	(1) a county mutual insurance company;
16	(2) a Lloyd's plan;
17	(3) a reciprocal or interinsurance exchange; and
18	(4) a farm mutual insurance company.
19	Sec. 551.253. EXEMPTIONS. This subchapter does not apply
20	<u>to:</u>
21	(1) a windstorm and hail insurance policy;
22	(2) a flood insurance policy; or
23	(3) a personal umbrella insurance policy.
24	Sec. 551.254. REQUIRED TYING OF RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY AND

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1	PERSONAL AUTOMOBILE POLICIES. (a) It is an unfair method of
2	competition or an unfair or deceptive act or practice in the
3	business of insurance under Chapter 541 to:
4	(1) make the issuance, delivery, or renewal of a
5	residential property insurance policy contingent on the purchase of
6	a personal automobile insurance policy from the same insurer or an
7	affiliated insurer or agent; or
8	(2) make the issuance, delivery, or renewal of a
9	personal automobile insurance policy contingent on the purchase of
10	a residential property insurance policy from the same insurer or an
11	affiliated insurer or agent.
12	(b) Notwithstanding Subchapter D, Chapter 541, or any other
13	law, a person may not bring a private action against an insurer or
14	an agent or representative of an insurer for a method, act, or
15	practice described by this section. This subsection does not limit
16	the authority of the attorney general to bring an action as provided
17	by Subchapter E or F, Chapter 541.

18 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
