A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to prohibitions on camping in a public place.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 364.002(a), Local Government Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	(a) A local entity may not adopt or enforce a policy under
7	which the entity prohibits or discourages the enforcement of any
8	public camping ban, including prohibiting or discouraging the
9	investigation or enforcement of a violation of a public camping
10	ban.
11	SECTION 2. Chapter 364, Local Government Code, is amended
12	by adding Sections 364.0021, 364.0022, 364.0023, and 364.0024 to
13	read as follows:
14	Sec. 364.0021. USE OF PROPERTY FOR CAMPING PURPOSE. A local
15	entity may not permit camping by homeless individuals on a property
16	designated for that purpose until the Texas Department of Housing
17	and Community Affairs has approved a plan for the property under
18	Section 2306.1122, Government Code.
19	Sec. 364.0022. COMPLAINTS AND REPORTING. (a) Each local
20	entity described by Section 364.001(1)(A) shall develop and
21	implement a process that allows a person to file a complaint with
22	the local entity regarding a violation of a public camping ban.
23	(b) Each year, a local entity described by Section
24	364.001(1)(A) shall report to the attorney general, in the form and

1 manner prescribed by the attorney general, the following 2 information: 3 (1) the number of complaints received as part of the 4 local entity's complaint process implemented under Subsection (a); 5 (2) the disposition of each complaint, including 6 court-ordered diversion programs; 7 (3) the number of arrests made or citations in lieu of arrest issued for a violation of a public camping ban; and 8 9 (4) any other information related to public camping bans as required by the attorney general. 10 11 Sec. 364.0023. ENFORCEMENT REQUIRED BY LOCAL ENTITY; DECLARATION AS "VIOLATING LOCAL ENTITY." (a) For each complaint 12 13 received by a local entity under Section 364.0022(a), the local entity shall take an action to resolve the complaint not later than 14 the 90th day after the date the complaint is received. 15 16 (b) If the local entity does not take the required action before the end of the period prescribed by Subsection (a), the 17 attorney general shall issue a written declaration that the local 18 entity is a "violating local entity" for the state fiscal year in 19 20 which the end of the period prescribed by Subsection (a) occurs. 21 The attorney general shall send a copy of the written declaration to the local entity and the comptroller. 22 Sec. 364.0024. ENFORCEMENT BY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY 23 AND ATTORNEY GENERAL; RECOVERY OF COSTS. (a) The attorney general 24 or the Department of Public Safety may enforce Section 48.05, Penal 25

26 Code.

27 (b) For each enforcement action described by Subsection (a)

that occurs within the boundaries of a local entity that is a 1 "violating local entity," the attorney general or Department of 2 3 Public Safety may recover any costs associated with the enforcement action from the local entity in accordance with Section 321.5026 or 4 323.5026, Tax Code, as applicable. 5 SECTION 3. Section 48.05, Penal Code, is 6 amended by 7 amending Subsection (i) and adding Subsection (i-1) to read as follows: 8 Subject to Subsection (i-1), if [If] the person is 9 (i)

9 (1) <u>subject to subsection (1-1), if</u> [41] the person is 10 arrested or detained solely for an offense under this section, a 11 peace officer enforcing this section shall ensure that all of the 12 person's personal property not designated as contraband under other 13 law is preserved by:

14 (1) permitting the person to remove all the property15 from the public place at the time of the person's departure; or

16 (2) taking custody of the <u>person's nonhazardous</u> 17 <u>personal</u> property and allowing the person to retrieve the property 18 after the person is released from custody.

19 (i-1) Subsection (i) does not apply to personal property
20 that is a permanent or semipermanent structure unless the structure
21 is a camping tent.

SECTION 4. Subchapter F, Chapter 321, Tax Code, is amended by adding Section 321.5026 to read as follows:

24 <u>Sec. 321.5026. DISTRIBUTION OF TRUST FUNDS TO MUNICIPALITY</u> 25 <u>THAT FAILS TO ACT ON PUBLIC CAMPING BAN COMPLAINT. (a) In this</u> 26 <u>section, "violating local entity" means a municipality declared by</u> 27 <u>the attorney general to be a violating local entity for a state</u>

fiscal year under Section 364.0023, Local Government Code.
(b) Notwithstanding Section 321.502, the comptroller may
not, after the date the comptroller receives notice that a
municipality is a violating local entity for a state fiscal year,
send to the municipality its share of the taxes collected by the
comptroller under this chapter during the state fiscal year until
the comptroller makes any deduction required by Subsection (c).

(c) Before sending a violating local entity its share of the 8 9 taxes collected by the comptroller under this chapter during a state fiscal year, the comptroller shall deduct the amount reported 10 11 to the comptroller for the violating local entity under Subsection (d) and credit that deducted amount to the general revenue fund. 12 13 Money credited to the general revenue fund under this subsection 14 may be appropriated only to the attorney general or the Department of Public Safety, as applicable. 15

16 (d) Not later than August 1 of each state fiscal year, the attorney general and the Department of Public Safety shall report 17 to the comptroller the amount of money the attorney general or 18 department spent in that state fiscal year taking enforcement 19 20 actions described by Section 364.0024, Local Government Code, in each violating local entity. The attorney general and the 21 department shall make a reasonable estimate of the amount spent 22 after the date the report is made until the end of the state fiscal 23 year based on amounts spent before the date the report is made. 24 25 SECTION 5. Subchapter F, Chapter 323, Tax Code, is amended

26 by adding Section 323.5026 to read as follows:

27 Sec. 323.5026. DISTRIBUTION OF TRUST FUNDS TO COUNTY THAT

1 FAILS TO ACT ON PUBLIC CAMPING BAN COMPLAINT. (a) In this section,
2 "violating local entity" means a county declared by the attorney
3 general to be a violating local entity for a state fiscal year under
4 Section 364.0023, Local Government Code.

5 (b) Notwithstanding Section 323.502, the comptroller may 6 not, after the date the comptroller receives notice that a county is 7 a violating local entity for a state fiscal year, send to the county 8 its share of the taxes collected by the comptroller under this 9 chapter during the state fiscal year until the comptroller makes 10 any deduction required by Subsection (c).

11 (c) Before sending a violating local entity its share of the taxes collected by the comptroller under this chapter during a 12 13 state fiscal year, the comptroller shall deduct the amount reported 14 to the comptroller for the violating local entity under Subsection (d) and credit that deducted amount to the general revenue fund. 15 Money credited to the general revenue fund under this subsection 16 17 may be appropriated only to the attorney general or the Department 18 of Public Safety, as applicable.

(d) Not later than August 1 of each state fiscal year, the 19 20 attorney general and the Department of Public Safety shall report to the comptroller the amount of money the attorney general or 21 department spent in that state fiscal year taking enforcement 22 23 actions described by Section 364.0024, Local Government Code, in each violating local entity. The attorney general and the 24 department shall make a reasonable estimate of the amount spent 25 26 after the date the report is made until the end of the state fiscal 27 year based on amounts spent before the date the report is made.

SECTION 6. Section 48.05, Penal Code, as amended by this 1 2 Act, applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of 3 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was 4 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that 5 purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed 6 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense 7 occurred before that date. 8

9 SECTION 7. Sections 321.5026 and 323.5026, Tax Code, as 10 added by this Act, apply only to a distribution of sales and use tax 11 revenue to a municipality or county in a state fiscal year that 12 begins on or after the effective date of this Act.

13 SECTION 8. Not later than December 1, 2025, each local 14 entity to which Section 364.0022(a), Local Government Code, as 15 added by this Act, applies shall develop and implement the 16 complaint process required by that section.

17 SECTION 9. Not later than January 1, 2026, the attorney 18 general by rule shall prescribe the form and manner for reporting as 19 required by Section 364.0022, Local Government Code, as added by 20 this Act.

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SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
