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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the availability of certain personal information of a 3 child, spouse, or surviving spouse of a current or former employee 4 of the office of the attorney general or of a public defender's 5 office.

BE IT ENACTEI

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

7 SECTION 1. Sections 552.117(a) and (c), Government Code, 8 are amended to read as follows:

9 (a) Information is excepted from the requirements of 10 Section 552.021 if it is information that relates to the home 11 address, home telephone number, emergency contact information, or 12 social security number of the following person or that reveals 13 whether the person has family members:

14 (1) a current or former official or employee of a15 governmental body, except as otherwise provided by Section 552.024;

16 (2) a current or honorably retired peace officer as 17 defined by Article 2A.001, Code of Criminal Procedure, or a current 18 or honorably retired security officer commissioned under Section 19 51.212, Education Code, regardless of whether the officer complies 20 with Section 552.024 or 552.1175, as applicable;

(3) a current or former employee of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice or of the predecessor in function of the department or any division of the department, regardless of whether the current or former employee complies with Section

1 552.1175;

(4) a peace officer as defined by Article 2A.001, Code of Criminal Procedure, or other law, a reserve law enforcement officer, a commissioned deputy game warden, or a corrections officer in a municipal, county, or state penal institution in this state who was killed in the line of duty, regardless of whether the deceased complied with Section 552.024 or 552.1175;

8 (5) a commissioned security officer as defined by 9 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code, regardless of whether the 10 officer complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175, as applicable;

(6) an officer or employee of a community supervision and corrections department established under Chapter 76 who performs a duty described by Section 76.004(b), regardless of whether the officer or employee complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175;

16 (7) a current or former employee of the office of the 17 attorney general <u>and a family member of the current or former</u> 18 <u>employee</u> [who is or was assigned to a division of that office the 19 duties of which involve law enforcement or are performed under 20 Chapter 231, Family Code], regardless of whether the <u>person</u> 21 [current or former employee] complies with Section 552.024 or 22 552.1175;

(8) a current or former employee of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department or of the predecessors in function of the department, regardless of whether the current or former employee complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175;

27 (9) a current or former juvenile probation or

1 supervision officer certified by the Texas Juvenile Justice 2 Department, or the predecessors in function of the department, 3 under Title 12, Human Resources Code, regardless of whether the 4 current or former officer complies with Section 552.024 or 5 552.1175;

6 (10) a current or former employee of a juvenile 7 justice program or facility, as those terms are defined by Section 8 261.405, Family Code, regardless of whether the current or former 9 employee complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175;

10 (11) a current or former member of the United States 11 Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, or Marine Corps, an auxiliary 12 service of one of those branches of the armed forces, or the Texas 13 military forces, as that term is defined by Section 437.001;

14 (12) a current or former district attorney, criminal 15 district attorney, or county or municipal attorney whose 16 jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child protective services 17 matters, regardless of whether the current or former attorney 18 complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175;

(13) a current or former employee of a district attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child protective services matters, regardless of whether the current or former employee complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175;

(14) a current or former employee of the Texas Civil
Commitment Office or of the predecessor in function of the office or
a division of the office, regardless of whether the current or
former employee complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175;

(15) a current or former federal judge or state judge, as those terms are defined by Section 1.005, Election Code, a federal bankruptcy judge, a marshal of the United States Marshals Service, a United States attorney, or a family member of a current or former federal judge, including a federal bankruptcy judge, a marshal of the United States Marshals Service, a United States attorney, or a state judge;

(16) a current or former child protective services 8 9 caseworker, adult protective services caseworker, or investigator for the Department of Family and Protective Services, regardless of 10 11 whether the caseworker or investigator complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175, or a current or former employee of a department 12 13 contractor performing child protective services caseworker, adult protective services caseworker, or investigator functions for the 14 15 contractor on behalf of the department;

16 (17) an elected public officer, regardless of whether 17 the officer complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175;

(18) a current or former United States attorney, assistant United States attorney, federal public defender, deputy federal public defender, or assistant federal public defender and the spouse or child of the current or former attorney or public defender, regardless of whether the person complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175; [or]

(19) a firefighter or volunteer firefighter or
emergency medical services personnel as defined by Section 773.003,
Health and Safety Code, regardless of whether the firefighter or
volunteer firefighter or emergency medical services personnel

1 comply with Section 552.024 or 552.1175, as applicable; or

2 (20) a current or former employee of a public 3 defender's office as defined by Article 26.044(a), Code of Criminal 4 Procedure, regardless of whether the current or former employee 5 complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175.

(c) In this section, "family member" means a minor child,
adult child, spouse, or surviving spouse [has the meaning assigned
by Section 31.006, Finance Code].

9 SECTION 2. Section 552.1175, Government Code, is amended by 10 amending Subsections (a) and (f) and adding Subsections (b-1) and 11 (i) to read as follows:

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(a) This section applies only to:

(1) current or honorably retired peace officers as defined by Article 2A.001, Code of Criminal Procedure, or special investigators as described by Article 2A.002, Code of Criminal Procedure;

17 (2) current or honorably retired county jailers as18 defined by Section 1701.001, Occupations Code;

(3) current or former employees of the Texas
Department of Criminal Justice or of the predecessor in function of
the department or any division of the department;

22 (4) commissioned security officers as defined by
23 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code;

(5) a current or former district attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child protective services matters;

1 (5-a) a current or former employee of a district 2 attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal 3 attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child 4 protective services matters;

5 (6) officers and employees of a community supervision 6 and corrections department established under Chapter 76 who perform 7 a duty described by Section 76.004(b);

8 (7) criminal investigators of the United States as
9 described by Article 2A.002(a), Code of Criminal Procedure;

10 (8) current or honorably retired police officers and
11 inspectors of the United States Federal Protective Service;

(9) current <u>or</u> [and] former employees of the office of the attorney general <u>and a family member of the current or former</u> <u>employee</u> [who are or were assigned to a division of that office the duties of which involve law enforcement or are performed under <u>Chapter 231, Family Code</u>];

(10) current or former juvenile probation and detention officers certified by the Texas Juvenile Justice Department, or the predecessors in function of the department, under Title 12, Human Resources Code;

(11) current or former employees of a juvenile justice program or facility, as those terms are defined by Section 261.405, Family Code;

(12) current or former employees of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department or the predecessors in function of the department;

27 (13) federal judges and state judges as defined by

1 Section 1.005, Election Code;

2 (14) current or former employees of the Texas Civil
3 Commitment Office or of the predecessor in function of the office or
4 a division of the office;

5 (15) a current or former member of the United States 6 Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, or Marine Corps, an auxiliary 7 service of one of those branches of the armed forces, or the Texas 8 military forces, as that term is defined by Section 437.001;

9 (16) a current or former child protective services caseworker, adult protective services caseworker, or investigator 10 11 for the Department of Family and Protective Services or a current or 12 former employee of a department contractor performing child 13 protective services caseworker, adult protective services 14 caseworker, or investigator functions for the contractor on behalf 15 of the department;

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(17) an elected public officer;

(18) a firefighter or volunteer firefighter or
emergency medical services personnel as defined by Section 773.003,
Health and Safety Code; [and]

(19) a current or former United States attorney,
assistant United States attorney, federal public defender, deputy
federal public defender, or assistant federal public defender; or

23 (20) a current or former employee of a public 24 defender's office as defined by Article 26.044(a), Code of Criminal 25 <u>Procedure</u>.

26 (b-1) Information included in a form submitted under
27 Subsection (b) and any supplemental information included as part of

the submission are confidential and not subject to disclosure under 1 2 this chapter.

A governmental body may redact information that must be (f) 3 withheld under Subsection (b) or (b-1) from any information the 4 governmental body discloses under Section 552.021 without the 5 necessity of requesting a decision from the attorney general under 6 7 Subchapter G.

(i) In this section, "family member" means a minor child, 8 adult child, spouse, or surviving spouse. 9

SECTION 3. Section 25.025(a), Tax Code, as amended by 10 Chapters 76 (S.B. 617), 152 (S.B. 870), 430 (H.B. 1911), 765 11 (H.B. 4504), and 937 (S.B. 1525), Acts of the 88th Legislature, 12 Regular Session, 2023, is reenacted and amended to read as follows: 13 14 (a) This section applies only to:

(7) an individual who shows that the individual, the individual's child, or another person in the individual's household is a victim of sexual assault or abuse, stalking, or trafficking of persons by providing:

(A) a copy of a protective order issued under
Subchapter A or B, Chapter 7B, Code of Criminal Procedure, or a
magistrate's order for emergency protection issued under Article
17.292, Code of Criminal Procedure; or

(B) other independent documentary evidence necessary to show that the individual, the individual's child, or another person in the individual's household is a victim of sexual assault or abuse, stalking, or trafficking of persons;

(8) a participant in the address confidentiality
program administered by the attorney general under Subchapter B,
Chapter 58, Code of Criminal Procedure, who provides proof of
certification under Article 58.059, Code of Criminal Procedure;
(9) a federal judge, a federal bankruptcy judge, a

marshal of the United States Marshals Service, a state judge, or a
 family member of a federal judge, a federal bankruptcy judge, a
 marshal of the United States Marshals Service, or a state judge;

4 (10) a current or former district attorney, criminal
5 district attorney, or county or municipal attorney whose
6 jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child protective services
7 matters;

8 (11) a current or former employee of a district 9 attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal 10 attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child 11 protective services matters;

12 (12) an officer or employee of a community supervision 13 and corrections department established under Chapter 76, 14 Government Code, who performs a duty described by Section 76.004(b) 15 of that code;

16 (13) a criminal investigator of the United States as
17 described by Article 2A.002(a), Code of Criminal Procedure;

18 (14) a current or honorably retired police officer or
19 inspector of the United States Federal Protective Service;

(15) a current or former United States attorney,
assistant United States attorney, federal public defender, deputy
federal public defender, or assistant federal public defender and
the spouse and child of the attorney or public defender;

(16) a current or former employee of the office of the
attorney general <u>and a family member of the current or former</u>
<u>employee</u> [who is or was assigned to a division of that office the
duties of which involve law enforcement or are performed under

1 Chapter 231, Family Code];

2 (17) a medical examiner or person who performs
3 forensic analysis or testing who is employed by this state or one or
4 more political subdivisions of this state;

5 (18) a current or former member of the United States 6 armed forces who has served in an area that the president of the 7 United States by executive order designates for purposes of 26 8 U.S.C. Section 112 as an area in which armed forces of the United 9 States are or have engaged in combat;

10 (19) a current or former employee of the Texas 11 Juvenile Justice Department or of the predecessors in function of 12 the department;

13 (20) a current or former juvenile probation or 14 supervision officer certified by the Texas Juvenile Justice 15 Department, or the predecessors in function of the department, 16 under Title 12, Human Resources Code;

17 (21) a current or former employee of a juvenile 18 justice program or facility, as those terms are defined by Section 19 261.405, Family Code;

20 (22) a current or former employee of the Texas Civil 21 Commitment Office or the predecessor in function of the office or a 22 division of the office;

23 (23) a current or former employee of a federal judge or24 state judge;

(24) a current or former child protective services
caseworker, adult protective services caseworker, or investigator
for the Department of Family and Protective Services or a current or

1 former employee of a department contractor performing child 2 protective services caseworker, adult protective services 3 caseworker, or investigator functions for the contractor on behalf 4 of the department;

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(25) an elected public officer;

6 (26) a firefighter or volunteer firefighter or
7 emergency medical services personnel as defined by Section 773.003,
8 Health and Safety Code;

9 (27) a customs and border protection officer or border 10 patrol agent of United States Customs and Border Protection or the 11 spouse, surviving spouse, or adult child of a customs and border 12 protection officer or border patrol agent<u>;</u>

13 <u>(28)</u> [(27) a current or former attorney for the 14 Department of Family and Protective Services

15 [(27)] a current or former employee or contract staff 16 member of a university health care provider at a corrections 17 facility operated by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice or 18 the Texas Juvenile Justice Department; [and]

19 (29) [(28)] a current or former attorney for the 20 Department of Family and Protective Services; and

21 (30) a current or former employee of a public
22 defender's office as defined by Article 26.044(a), Code of Criminal
23 <u>Procedure</u>.

24 SECTION 4. Section 25.025(a-1)(1), Tax Code, is amended to 25 read as follows:

(1) "Family member" <u>means a minor child, adult child,</u>
 <u>spouse</u>, or surviving spouse [has the meaning assigned by Section

1 31.006, Finance Code].

2 SECTION 5. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails 3 over another Act of the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, 4 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted 5 codes.

6 SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 7 a request for information that is received by a governmental body or 8 an officer on or after the effective date of this Act.

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SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
