- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 85.0011(b) and (c), Local Government
- 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:

- 7 (b) A person is not eligible to serve as sheriff unless the
- 8 person:

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- 9 (1) has a high school diploma or a high school
- 10 equivalency certificate; and
- 11 (2) either:
- 12 (A) holds an active permanent peace officer
- 13 license under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; or
- 14 (B) is eligible to be licensed under Sections
- 15 1701.309 and 1701.312, Occupations Code, obtains a license
- 16 described by Paragraph (A) within the time provided by Section
- 17 <u>1701.302(a)</u>, Occupations Code, and:
- 18 (i) has a minimum of five years of
- 19 experience as a federal special investigator; or
- 20 (ii) is a military veteran with a minimum of
- 21 10 years of combined active duty or national guard service
- 22 experience.
- (c) A person is not eligible to be a candidate for the office
- 24 of sheriff unless the person:

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- 1 (1) holds an active permanent peace officer license
- 2 under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; $[\tau]$ or
- 3 (2) is a person described by Subsection (b)(2)(B)(i)
- 4 or (ii) and <u>intends to obtain</u> [obtains] a license <u>described by</u>
- 5 Subdivision (1) within the time provided by Section 1701.302(a),
- 6 Occupations Code.
- 7 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 86, Local Government Code,
- 8 is amended by adding Section 86.0025 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 86.0025. QUALIFICATIONS FOR CONSTABLE OR CANDIDATE FOR
- 10 CONSTABLE. (a) In this section, "active duty," "federal special
- 11 investigator," and "military veteran" have the meanings assigned by
- 12 Section 85.0011.
- (b) A person is not eligible to serve as constable unless
- 14 the person:
- 15 (1) has a high school diploma or a high school
- 16 equivalency certificate; and
- 17 (2) either:
- 18 (A) holds an active permanent peace officer
- 19 <u>license under Chapter 1701</u>, Occupations Code; or
- 20 (B) is eligible to be licensed under Sections
- 21 1701.309 and 1701.312, Occupations Code, obtains a license
- 22 described by Paragraph (A) within the time provided by Section
- 23 1701.302(a), Occupations Code, and:
- (i) has a minimum of five years of
- 25 experience as a federal special investigator; or
- 26 <u>(ii) is a military veteran with a minimum of</u>
- 27 10 years of combined active duty or national guard service

- 1 <u>experience.</u>
- 2 (c) A person is not eligible to be a candidate for the office
- 3 of constable unless the person:
- 4 (1) holds an active permanent peace officer license
- 5 under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; or
- 6 (2) is a person described by Subsection (b)(2)(B)(i)
- 7 or (ii) and intends to obtain a license described by Subdivision (1)
- 8 within the time provided by Section 1701.302(a), Occupations Code.
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 1701.302(a), Occupations Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) Except as provided by <u>Sections 85.0011(b)(2)(A) and</u>
- 12 86.0025(b)(2)(A) [Section 85.0011], Local Government Code, an
- 13 officer, including a sheriff and constable, elected under the Texas
- 14 Constitution or a statute or appointed to fill a vacancy in an
- 15 elective office must obtain a license from the commission not later
- 16 than the second anniversary of the date the officer takes office.
- 17 SECTION 4. Section 86.0021, Local Government Code, is
- 18 repealed.
- 19 SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act do not apply
- 20 to a sheriff or constable serving a term that began before the
- 21 effective date of this Act. A sheriff or constable serving a term
- 22 that began before the effective date of this Act is governed for the
- 23 remainder of that term by the law as it existed immediately before
- 24 the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect
- 25 for that purpose.
- 26 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
