- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 48.02(d), Penal Code, is amended to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 (d) An offense under [A violation of] this section is a
- 8 state jail felony [Class A misdemeanor].
- 9 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 164, Occupations Code, is
- 10 amended by adding Section 164.0571 to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 164.0571. REQUIRED REVOCATION OF LICENSE FOR PROCEDURE
- 12 INVOLVING CERTAIN HUMAN ORGANS. The board shall revoke the license
- 13 of a physician if the physician knowingly uses a human organ
- 14 <u>obtained in violation of Section 48.02, Penal Code, in a medical</u>
- 15 procedure.
- SECTION 3. Section 48.02(d), Penal Code, as amended by this
- 17 Act, applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective
- 18 date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of
- 19 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was
- 20 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 21 purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed
- 22 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 23 occurred before that date.
- SECTION 4. Section 164.0571, Occupations Code, as added by

S.B. No. 456

- 1 this Act, applies only to conduct that occurs on or after the
- 2 effective date of this Act. Conduct that occurs before the
- 3 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 4 date the conduct occurred, and the former law is continued in effect
- 5 for that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
