A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

S.B. No. 481

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- 2 relating to emergency preparedness and response plans for the
- 3 continued care and safety of nursing facility and assisted living
- 4 facility residents.

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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 242, Health and Safety
- 7 Code, is amended by adding Section 242.053 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 242.053. EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE PLAN.
- 9 (a) In this section, "emergency" means an incident likely to
- 10 threaten the health, welfare, or safety of residents, personnel, or
- 11 the public at a nursing facility, including a fire, an equipment
- 12 <u>failure</u>, a power outage, a flood, an interruption in utility
- 13 <u>service</u>, a medical emergency, or a natural or other disaster.
- 14 (b) Each nursing facility shall:
- (1) adopt and implement an emergency preparedness and
- 16 response plan for the continued care and safety of residents and the
- 17 continuity of the facility's essential building systems during an
- 18 emergency; and
- 19 (2) prepare and annually update as necessary a written
- 20 policy, including procedures, to ensure the facility activates,
- 21 operates, and maintains generators or alternate power sources and
- 22 fuel resources required under this section.
- (c) An emergency preparedness and response plan adopted in
- 24 accordance with this section must:

1 (1) require a nursing facility to install and maintain 2 on the facility's premises: 3 (A) an emergency generator or alternate power 4 source; 5 (B) a fuel supply with enough capacity to power 6 the emergency generator or alternate power source for not less than 7 96 hours; and 8 (C) a carbon monoxide alarm or detector that complies with rules the executive commissioner adopts; and 9 10 (2) include strategies to: (A) prevent resident complications from heat 11 12 exposure during a power outage, including requiring the facility to maintain a temperature between 71 degrees and 81 degrees 13 14 Fahrenheit; 15 (B) safely transport residents to an appropriate facility when the facility's management knows the facility is 16 17 unable to maintain the facility's temperature within a range safe for residents; and 18 19 (C) respond to inquiries from residents' family members during an emergency. 20 (d) Each nursing facility shall provide to facility 21 22 personnel the written policy prepared in accordance with Subsection (b)(2) and relevant training on the facility's emergency 23 24 preparedness and response plan adopted under this section. 25 (e) In preparing for or responding to an emergency, a

nursing facility shall follow each procedure or requirement

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outlined in:

- 1 (1) the emergency preparedness and response plan the
- 2 facility adopts under this section, including contingency
- 3 procedures or requirements to meet a resident's individual medical
- 4 needs; and
- 5 (2) the written policy prepared in accordance with
- 6 Subsection (b)(2).
- 7 (f) The commission shall review and approve each nursing
- 8 facility's emergency preparedness and response plan required by
- 9 this section and each update to the plan. The commission may revoke
- 10 a facility's license issued under this chapter for failure to
- 11 comply with this section or rules adopted under this section.
- 12 (g) The executive commissioner shall adopt the rules
- 13 necessary to administer and enforce this section.
- 14 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 247, Health and Safety
- 15 Code, is amended by adding Section 247.073 to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 247.073. EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE PLAN.
- 17 (a) In this section, "emergency" means an incident likely to
- 18 threaten the health, welfare, or safety of residents, personnel, or
- 19 the public at an assisted living facility, including a fire, an
- 20 equipment failure, a power outage, a flood, an interruption in
- 21 utility service, a medical emergency, or a natural or other
- 22 <u>disaster.</u>
- 23 (b) Each assisted living facility shall:
- 24 (1) adopt and implement an emergency preparedness and
- 25 response plan for the continued care and safety of residents and the
- 26 continuity of the facility's essential building systems during an
- 27 emergency; and

1	(2) prepare and annually update as necessary a written							
2	policy, including procedures, to ensure the facility activates,							
3	operates, and maintains generators or alternate power sources and							
4	fuel resources required under this section.							
5	(c) An emergency preparedness and response plan adopted in							
6	accordance with this section must:							
7	(1) require an assisted living facility to install and							
8	<pre>maintain on the facility's premises:</pre>							
9	(A) an emergency generator or alternate power							
10	source;							
11	(B) a fuel supply with enough capacity to power							
12	the emergency generator or alternate power source for not less than							
13	96 hours; and							
14	(C) a carbon monoxide alarm or detector that							
15	complies with rules the executive commissioner adopts; and							
16	(2) include strategies to:							
17	(A) prevent resident complications from heat							
18	exposure during a power outage, including requiring the facility to							
19	maintain a temperature between 71 degrees and 81 degrees							
20	Fahrenheit;							
21	(B) safely transport residents to an appropriate							
22	facility when the facility's management knows the facility is							
23	unable to maintain the facility's temperature within a range safe							
24	for residents; and							
25	(C) respond to inquiries from residents' family							
26	members during an emergency.							
27	(d) Each assisted living facility shall provide to facility							

- 1 personnel the written policy prepared in accordance with Subsection
- 2 (b)(2) and relevant training on the facility's emergency
- 3 preparedness and response plan adopted under this section.
- 4 (e) In preparing for or responding to an emergency, an
- 5 assisted living facility shall follow each procedure or requirement
- 6 outlined in:
- 7 (1) the emergency preparedness and response plan the
- 8 facility adopts under this section, including contingency
- 9 procedures or requirements to meet a resident's individual medical
- 10 needs; and
- 11 (2) the written policy prepared in accordance with
- 12 Subsection (b)(2).
- 13 (f) The commission shall review and approve each assisted
- 14 living facility's emergency preparedness and response plan
- 15 required by this section and each update to the plan. The
- 16 commission may revoke a facility's license issued under this
- 17 chapter for failure to comply with this section or rules adopted
- 18 <u>under this section</u>.
- 19 (g) The executive commissioner shall adopt the rules
- 20 necessary to administer and enforce this section.
- 21 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 22 of this Act, each nursing facility and assisted living facility
- 23 shall adopt and implement an emergency preparedness and response
- 24 plan as required by Sections 242.053 and 247.073, Health and Safety
- 25 Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 27 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human

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- 1 Services Commission shall adopt the rules required by Sections
- 2 242.053 and 247.073, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
