1 AN ACT 2 relating to the establishment of a theft of petroleum products task 3 force. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. (a) In this Act: 5 (1) "Commission" means the Railroad Commission of 6 7 Texas. "Theft of petroleum product" means 8 (2) conduct constituting an offense under Section 31.19, Penal Code. 9 The commission shall appoint a task force to study and 10 (b) make recommendations related to preventing the theft of petroleum 11 12 products in this state. 13 (c) The task force must include: 14 (1) at least one representative from the oil and gas 15 industry; (2) at least one representative from an energy trade 16 17 association; and representatives from local, state, and federal law 18 (3) 19 enforcement agencies. The commission shall designate a member of the task 20 (d) 21 force as the presiding officer. 22 (e) The task force shall meet at least quarterly at the call 23 of the presiding officer. A task force meeting may be conducted 24 virtually through the Internet.

1 (f) The task force shall conduct an ongoing study of the 2 theft of petroleum products in this state. In conducting the study, 3 the task force shall:

4 (1) review laws and regulations addressing the theft 5 of petroleum products in other jurisdictions, including 6 international political and economic organizations;

7 (2) analyze:

8 (A) the impact of the theft of petroleum products9 on the collection of sales tax;

10 (B) the long-term economic impacts of the theft11 of petroleum products; and

12 (C) the advantages and disadvantages of taking
13 various actions to reduce the theft of petroleum products; and
14 (3) make recommendations regarding:

(A) theft of petroleum product outreach and
prevention programs, including coordination among stakeholders,
including local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies; and

(B) training for law enforcement officers and
 prosecutors on effective strategies for combating the theft of
 petroleum products.

(g) In conducting the study under Subsection (f) of this section, the members of the task force may consult with any organization, governmental entity, or person the task force considers necessary.

(h) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year,
the task force shall prepare and submit a report of the study
conducted under Subsection (f) of this section to the governor, the

lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
 the commission, and each standing committee of the legislature with
 primary jurisdiction over oil and gas matters.

4 (i) The report submitted under Subsection (h) of this 5 section:

6 (1) must include legislative and other 7 recommendations to increase transparency, improve security, 8 enhance consumer protections, prevent the theft of petroleum 9 products, and address the long-term economic impact of the theft of 10 petroleum products; and

11

(2) may be submitted electronically.

(j) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the duration of the task force or to the designation of the task force's presiding officer.

15 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 16 of this Act, the Railroad Commission of Texas shall appoint the 17 theft of petroleum products task force as required by this Act.

18 SECTION 3. This Act expires December 31, 2030.

19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
