## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to prohibiting an officer or employee of this state or of a 2 political subdivision of this state from distributing certain voter 3 4 registration application forms and to the notice of availability of such forms; creating criminal offenses. 5

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

7 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 13, Election Code, is 8 amended by adding Section 13.009 to read as follows:

Sec. 13.009. DISTRIBUTION OF APPLICATION; OFFENSE. (a) 9 10 Except as otherwise provided by a provision of this code, including provisions of this chapter and Chapter 20, an officer or employee of 11 this state or of a political subdivision of this state may not, 12 while engaged in the actual discharge of the officer's or employee's 13 duties, distribute a form on which a person may apply for 14 15 registration to a person who did not request it.

(b) An officer or employee of this state or of a political 16 17 subdivision of this state may not enter into a contract with a third-party vendor permitting the use of public funds to distribute 18 a form the officer or employee would be prohibited from 19 20 distributing under Subsection (a).

21 (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), a political party, an 22 elected official, or a candidate for office may distribute a form described by Subsection (a) to a person who did not request it. 23

24 (d) An office of a state agency or a political subdivision

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1	at which a person may request a form on which the person may apply
2	for registration shall display a notice indicating that
3	registration forms are available on request. A notice displayed
4	under this subsection shall be posted in English, Spanish, and any
5	other language in which election materials are required to be
6	provided in the political subdivision in which the office is
7	located under Section 272.011.
8	(e) An officer or employee of this state or of a political
9	subdivision of this state commits an offense if the officer or
10	employee violates Subsection (a) or (b).
11	(f) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor,
12	unless the officer or employee violated Subsection (b), in which
13	event the offense is a Class A misdemeanor.

14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
