3	penalty for a violation of a money services business's terms of

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter G, Chapter 152,
7	Finance Code, is amended to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER G. GENERAL DUTIES AND RESTRICTIONS FOR [TIMELY
9	TRANSMISSION, REFUNDS, AND DISCLOSURES BY] MONEY TRANSMISSION
10	LICENSEE
11	SECTION 2. Subchapter G, Chapter 152, Finance Code, is
12	amended by adding Section 152.305 to read as follows:
13	Sec. 152.305. PROHIBITION ON IMPOSITION OF FINE OR PENALTY
14	FOR TERMS OF SERVICE VIOLATION. (a) A money transmission
15	licensee may not include in the licensee's terms of service
16	agreement a provision allowing or providing for a monetary fine or
17	penalty for violating any provision of the terms of service
18	agreement.
19	(b) This section may not be construed to prevent a money
20	transmission licensee from closing a customer account as a result
21	of a customer's violation of the licensee's terms of service
22	agreement.
23	(c) In addition to any other relief provided for a violation

of this chapter, a money transmission licensee that violates this

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- 1 section is liable to this state for a civil penalty in an amount
- 2 equal to three times the amount of the fine or penalty imposed by
- 3 the licensee.
- 4 (d) The attorney general may bring an action in the name of
- 5 the state to recover the civil penalty under Subsection (c). The
- 6 attorney general may recover attorney's fees and costs incurred in
- 7 bringing an action under Subsection (c).
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act applies only to a terms of service
- 9 agreement entered into after the effective date of this Act. A
- 10 terms of service agreement entered into before the effective date
- 11 of this Act is governed by the law as it existed immediately before
- 12 the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 13 effect for that purpose.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
