A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the issuance of a driver's license to certain persons
- 3 that includes an alternative to the license holder's residence
- 4 address.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 521.1211, Transportation
- 7 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 521.1211. DRIVER'S LICENSE FOR <u>PAROLE OFFICERS</u>, PEACE
- 9 OFFICERS, AND PROSECUTORS.
- 10 SECTION 2. Sections 521.1211(a), (a-1), (d), and (f),
- 11 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) In this section:
- 13 (1) "Parole officer" has the meaning assigned by
- 14 Section 508.001, Government Code.
- 15 (1-a) "Peace officer" has the meaning assigned by
- 16 Article 2A.001, Code of Criminal Procedure, except that the term
- 17 includes a special investigator as defined by Article 2A.002, Code
- 18 of Criminal Procedure.
- 19 (2) "Prosecutor" means a county attorney, district
- 20 attorney, criminal district attorney, assistant county attorney,
- 21 assistant district attorney, or assistant criminal district
- 22 attorney.
- 23 (a-1) This section applies only to a parole officer, a peace
- 24 officer, and a prosecutor.

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- If the holder of a driver's license that includes an 1 alternative address moves to a new residence, or, for a parole 2 officer or prosecutor, to a new office address, or if the name of 3 the person is changed by marriage or otherwise, the license holder 4 shall, not later than the 30th day after the date of the address or 5 name change, notify the department and provide the department with 6 7 the number of the person's driver's license and, as applicable, the 8 person's:
- 9 (1) former and new addresses; or
- 10 (2) former and new names.
- 11 (f) The department shall accept as an alternative address:
- 12 (1) <u>for a parole officer, the address of an office of</u>
 13 <u>the parole officer;</u>
- 14 (2) for a peace officer, an address that is in the:
- 15 (A) municipality or county of the peace officer's
- 16 residence; or
- 17 (B) county of the peace officer's place of
- 18 employment; and
- 19 $\underline{(3)}$ [$\frac{(2)}{}$] for a prosecutor, the address of an office of
- 20 the prosecutor.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
