4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 5 SECTION 1. (a) In this section, "commission" means the 6 Health and Human Services Commission.
- 7 (b) The commission shall conduct a study regarding the 8 availability of beds at inpatient mental health facilities in this 9 state that provide acute inpatient psychiatric treatment. The
- 10 study must evaluate:
- 11 (1) the current number of psychiatric beds available 12 at inpatient mental health facilities in this state that provide 13 inpatient psychiatric treatment to individuals experiencing an 14 acute mental health crisis, including a breakdown of beds available 15 for patients:
- 16 (A) committed to a facility for competency
- 17 restoration services under Chapter 46B, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 18 (B) civilly committed to a facility under Chapter
- 19 841, Health and Safety Code;
- 20 (C) committed to a facility after having been
- 21 found not guilty by reason of insanity under Chapter 46C, Code of
- 22 Criminal Procedure;
- 24 (E) 18 years of age or older;

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1 (F) younger than 18 years of age; receiving long-term mental health treatment 2 (G) 3 in a facility; and 4 (H) who have been diagnosed with an intellectual 5 or developmental disability; 6 (2) the current number of patients admitted to an 7 inpatient mental health facility in this state that provides 8 inpatient psychiatric treatment to individuals experiencing an acute mental health crisis, including a breakdown of: 9 (A) the number of patients committed to 10 facility for competency restoration services under Chapter 46B, 11 Code of Criminal Procedure, including the number of individuals 12 committed under an initial order of commitment or an order 13 14 extending the initial restoration period; 15 (B) the number of patients civilly committed to a 16 facility under Chapter 841, Health and Safety Code; 17 (C) the number of patients committed facility after having been found not guilty by reason of insanity 18 under Chapter 46C, Code of Criminal Procedure; 19 20 (D) the number of patients voluntarily admitted to a facility; 21 (E) the number of patients 18 years of age or 22 23 older;

- 11 workforce needs, necessary to meet the demands described by
- 12 Subdivisions (1), (2), and (3) of this subsection.
- 13 (c) In designing and conducting the study, the commission
- 14 may collaborate with institutions of higher education in this state
- 15 that award medical degrees.
- 16 (d) Not later than September 1, 2026, the commission shall
- 17 prepare and submit to the legislature a written report containing
- 18 the results of the study and any recommendations for legislative or
- 19 other action.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act expires September 1, 2027.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
